**ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR EXTENSION  
OF TIME TO FILE PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

On June 4,<sup>1</sup> Kansas City Power & Light Company (“KCP&L”) submitted to the Commission proposed tariff sheets intended to implement a general rate increase for electrical service provided in its Missouri service area. The Commission issued an Order and Notice on June 11, in which it ordered parties to file a proposed procedural schedule by July 20.

On July 19, KCP&L filed a Motion for Extension of Time to File Procedural Schedule. KCP&L states that it and Staff believe one additional week to negotiate a procedural schedule would be beneficial.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(15) allows parties ten days to respond to motions. However, because the proposed procedural schedule would be due today if the Commission does not grant the motion, and because KCP&L states that no party opposes the motion, the Commission will dispense with the ten-day requirement for responses. The Commission will take up the motion unopposed, and will grant it.
