**ORDER RE-ORGANIZING DOCKET AND RESTRICTING DOCKET  
FILINGS TO PROPER PLEADINGS AND MOTIONS WITH  
REGULATORY LAW JUDGE REVIEW**

There have been 57 separate docket filings made in this case since it began on November 20, 2024. Most of these filings are not pleadings or motions as contemplated by the Commission’s Rules on Practice and Procedure found at 20 CSR 4240-2, et. seq., but appear to be unrelated to many of the facts and issues pending in this complaint case. The purpose of the Commission’s Electronic Filing Information System (EFIS) is not to insult and harass other parties, the Commission, or Commission employees, and to make unsubstantiated claims, but to align the parties’ central arguments in the complaint with relevant documents.

The Commission reminds the parties that pursuant to the Commission’s Rules: each pleading must include a clear and concise statement of the relief requested, a specific reference to the statutory provision or other authority under which relief is requested, and a concise statement of the facts entitling the party to relief.<sup>1</sup> Pleadings

which are not in substantial compliance with the Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.080, applicable statutes, or Commission orders may not be accepted.<sup>2</sup>

EFIS contains the case records for cases before the Commission. It is not a blog or forum where individuals can record and share their personal thoughts. EFIS was designed to accept and record proper pleadings or legitimate motions. The filing history herein appears to reflect a possible abuse of the Commission complaint process. The Commission has given parties in the past great leeway, especially those acting pro se, to make their cases, but will no longer tolerate abuse of the system by use of filings that are not in conformance with 20 CSR 4240-2, et. seq.

Therefore, the Commission will direct its Data Center to restrict this particular file to further filings only upon a judge review of such documents. The parties may make filings in this case only as directed by order, or with the permission of the Regulatory Law Judge.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The Data Center shall close this case to further filings by the parties except as directed by order or with the permission of the Regulatory Law Judge.
2. Any proper pleading or motion may be filed in this case only by mailing it to the Secretary of the Public Service Commission at P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102-0360; or by delivering to the Public Service Commission, 200 Madison St., Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102-0360; or by electronic mail to EC-2025-0165@psc.mo.gov.
3. This order shall be effective January 16, 2025.
