ORDER SETTING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Issue Date: March 9, 2022 Effective Date: March 9, 2022

On January 19, 2022, The Empire District Electric Company d/b/a Liberty, applied for a financing order to allow it to issue securitized utility tariff bonds pursuant to Section 393.1700, RSMo, for extraordinary costs related to Winter Storm Uri. The parties submitted an amended proposed procedural schedule on March 2, 2022.¹

The proposed procedural schedule includes dates for Liberty to file a petition and direct testimony regarding a proposal to issue securitized utility tariff bonds for extraordinary costs related to the retirement of the Asbury generating plant.² The proposed procedural schedule also indicates Liberty's intent to file a motion to consolidate the Asbury case into the Winter Storm Uri case for a single hearing. In establishing the schedule requested by the parties, the Commission is not making a ruling on the yet-to-be-filed motion to consolidate the two cases.

The Commission will adopt the parties' proposed procedural schedule, except that the hearing transcript will be expedited and the briefing schedule will be modified.

- 2. The parties shall comply with the following procedures:
 - (a) All parties must comply with the requirements of Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.130 for prepared testimony, including the requirement that testimony be filed on line-numbered pages.
 - (b) Although not all parties may agree upon how each issue should be described or on whether a listed issue is in fact a proper issue in this case, the parties shall agree upon and file a list of the issues to be heard, the witnesses to appear on each day of the hearing, the order in which they will be called, and the order of cross-examination for each witness. The list of issues should be detailed enough to inform the Commission of each issue that must be resolved. The Commission will view any issue not contained in this list of issues as uncontested and not requiring resolution by the Commission.
 - (c) Each party shall file a simple and concise statement summarizing its position on each disputed issue, including citations to pre-filed testimony supporting its position.
 - (d) All pleadings, briefs, and amendments shall be filed in accordance with Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.080. Briefs shall follow the same list of issues as filed in the case and must set forth and cite the proper portions of the record concerning the remaining unresolved issues that are to be decided by the Commission.
 - (e) If testimony or documents are prefiled and served upon the parties before a hearing, a party need only provide a copy of the testimony or document to the court reporter for marking as an exhibit. If not prefiled and served

upon the parties, then a party who has a document marked for use at the hearing shall have sufficient copies of the document to provide a copy not only to the court reporter, but also to each of the Commissioners, the presiding officer, and counsel for each other party.

- (f) Data requests and other discovery served on a non-business day, or after 5:00 p.m. on a business day, shall be deemed served on the following business day.
- 3. The hearing shall be held at the Commission's office at the Governor Office Building, Room 310, 200 Madison Street, Jefferson City, Missouri. This building meets accessibility standards required by the Americans with Disabilities Act.
