6	the actual hearing. Because of how the Commission
7	works, they only have agenda meetings once a week.
8	Those are typically held on Wednesdays, and that is
9	the reason that I ask for those things to be submitted
10	at least a week in advance.

11 A quick note on position statements. As I 12 referenced, I am putting together a memo for the 13 commissioners to include your position statements. If your position statement is one to two paragraphs, I 14 15 generally don't edit it. If it's longer than that, 16 then I do need to edit it for the length of the 17 statement, not necessarily for substance. Just a 18 head's up on that.

19 The schedule -- proposed procedural 20 schedule should include at least one more settlement 21 conference, not counting today's discussion. And also 22 make sure and account for a 10-day -- that's 10 23 business days for transcript turn around. That's 24 going to be important for our briefings. After the 25 evidentiary hearing, if the parties would like a
