ORDER DIRECTING FILING

The current case involves revisions to Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri's line extension policy and new programs known as "Charge Ahead" creating incentives for Electric Motor Vehicle (EMV) charging stations and for the use of electric equipment at certain businesses. Various working groups and contested cases at the Commission have noted a strong public policy in favor of incentivizing development of the electric vehicle market.¹

In the current case, the Commission has adopted a joint procedural schedule and suspended the tariffs until February 21, 2019. In addition to the issues brought forward by the parties, the Commission will direct its Staff to analyze and report the benefits or detriments of Ameren Missouri instituting a line extension policy designed specifically to incentivize construction of EMV charging stations, such as allowing the utility to rate base line extension costs regardless of the amount of marginal sales resulting from the line extension. The Commission will direct Staff to file a proposal for tariffs and the

Commission will receive responses to that proposal. Any other party may also submit such a proposal for tariff revisions.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. No later than August 31, 2018, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission shall, and any other party may, analyze and report the benefits or detriments of Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri instituting a line extension policy designed specifically to incentivize construction of electric motor vehicle charging stations and shall propose tariffs designed to support such policy.

2. Responses to the filings set out in Ordered Paragraph 1 shall be filed no later than September 28, 2018.

3. This order is effective when issued.
