All projected 392.1, 392.2, 392.3, 392.4 Transportation additions from February 2024 through May 2025 were only recorded in 392.3 (Transportation Equipment Cars), not the specific 392.1, 392.2, 392.3, 392.4 Transportation Equipment NARUC accounts.

As an update, the January 2024 through May 2025 392.3 Transportation Equipment Cars additions have been distributed to expected 392.1, 392.2, 392.3, 392.4 Transportation NARUC accounts. The addition totals remain the same.

Support for these additions can be found in Company Witness Derek Linam's Direct Testimony, Page 11, Line 8, "The purchase of tools, furniture, equipment, and vehicles is based on required needs." MAWC reviews each item independently and prepares an itemized list of expenditures. Estimates are made based on the current year pricing. The criteria for evaluating the priority of the RPs include: regulatory requirements; risk and resiliency evaluations; asset condition assessments and engineering requirements; consideration of national, state, and local trends; operational and water quality needs; pipeline prioritization (as described above) and external paving/road construction

plans; environmental impact evaluations; water resource management; and consideration of national trends in cybersecurity."
