As we discussed on the phone today it is the objective of our agency to minimize the negative impacts to the natural resources and the users of Apple Creek Conservation Area. As I stated in our conversation with you this morning it is our understanding that the new line will cross form the west side of the existing easement to the east side after entering the conservation area and stay on the east side until they clear the existing shooting range boundary. Once clear of the shooting range they are moving back over to the west side of the existing line.

Hello. My property borders the Apple Creek CA shooting range on the south. During the course of the "limestone ridge project" our properties are going to have transmission poles placed on them. It has been my understanding that Ameren's intent has always been to place the poles on the west side of the existing Citizens Electric transmission lines. I received an email stating that the understanding was, the lines were going to be switching to the east side before coming onto the shooting range, and then switch back to the west after passing it, and then entering my property on County Road 532.

However, I just received an email from a lawyer that is working with Ameren that states.... "As to the location of the line, the MDC email is incorrect. The current plan has the line crossing the 69kV line on the Mark Petzoldt property and staying on the west side until it departs the existing corridor to connect to the new substation facilities at the terminus of the project."

I have a family burial plot on the west side and my request was for Ameren to keep it on the east from before it gets to the shooting range until after it leaves my property. However they are claiming that it does not cross for the shooting range. I feel like someone is either lying to me or to you. We have talked with Pam and she said that it does cross before the shooting range, but again the Ameren lawyer claims she is wrong, and it does not. Any help, input, or documentation you might have to show whether it crosses or not would be helpful, but either way you may want to get in contact with someone about the line's location because there is apparently some confusion as to the location of the line.
