1           LAW JUDGE WALKER: We're going to go on the  
2 record. This is a prehearing conference for  
3 EO-2025-0154. It's April 21st, 2025, and the time is  
4 10:00 p.m. The Commission has set this time for a  
5 prehearing conference in the matter captioned as in  
6 the matter of the application of Evergy Metro,  
7 Incorporated, doing business as Evergy Missouri Metro  
8 and Evergy Missouri West, Incorporated, doing business  
9 as Evergy Missouri West for the approval of a new and  
10 modified tariff for service to large load customers,  
11 and the case number is E0-2025-0154.

12           My name is Karolin Walker, and I'm the  
13 regulatory law judge in this matter. We're going to  
14 begin by having the attorneys make their entry of  
15 appearance. We'll start with Evergy Missouri Metro.

16           MR. STEINER: Good morning. This is Roger  
17 Steiner. My address is 1200 Main Street, Kansas City,  
18 Missouri 64106. 64105, sorry. I think there's some  
19 other -- like Jim Fischer.

20           MR. FISCHER: James Fischer.

21           MR. STEINER: And -- go ahead, Jim.

22           MR. FISCHER: Yeah. James Fischer on  
23 behalf of the company, too. Our address is -- well,  
24 it's Fischer & Dority, P.C., 2081 Honeysuckle Lane,  
25 Jefferson City, Missouri 65109.

1 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Okay. And are you  
2 representing Evergy Missouri West?

3 MR. FISCHER: Yes.

4 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Okay.

5 MR. FISCHER: Both companies.

6 MR. STEINER: Both companies.

7 LAW JUDGE WALKER: All right. How about  
8 Commission staff?

9 MR. PRINGLE: Yeah. Thank you, Judge.  
10 This is Travis Pringle and Lexi Klaus is also on the  
11 line for staff. The address, 200 Madison Street,  
12 Jefferson City, MO.

13 LAW JUDGE WALKER: The Office of Public  
14 Counsel.

15 MR. CLIZER: John Clizer on behalf of the  
16 Missouri Office of Public Counsel. My contact  
17 information should be in the record.

18 LAW JUDGE WALKER: What about the Data  
19 Center Coalition. Hearing no one, Nucor Steel  
20 Sedalia, LLC.

21 MR. ELLINGER: Morning, Judge. Marc  
22 Ellinger with the law firm of Ellinger Bell on behalf  
23 of Nucor. Our address information should be on our  
24 filings also. Thank you.

25 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Okay. Velvet Tech

1 Services, LLC.

2 MS. BELL: Good morning, Your Honor.  
3 Stephanie Bell on behalf of Velvet Tech Services. Our  
4 address is on our filing.

5 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Google, LLC.

6 MR. CARO: Good morning, Your Honor. This  
7 is Frank Caro on behalf of Google, LLC, along with  
8 Sean Pluta with the Polsinelli Law Firm. Our address  
9 is 900 West 48th Place, Suite 900, Kansas City,  
10 Missouri.

11 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Sierra Club.

12 MR. MORRISON: Good morning, Judge. Good  
13 morning. It's Bruce Morrison, Great Rivers  
14 Environmental Law Center in St. Louis. Our address  
15 should be on our filing.

16 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Okay. Renew Missouri.

17 MR. OWEN: Good morning, Your Honor. This  
18 is James Owen. I'm the executive director counsel for  
19 Renew Missouri. I'm here on behalf of Nicole Mers who  
20 is our counsel of record, but she has a conflict  
21 today. Our address should be on the filing, and  
22 that's our announcement. Thank you.

23 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Okay. Is there anyone  
24 I've missed? Okay. My little disclaimer for this is  
25 that we can rule on procedural and substantive issues

1 at the PSC, and the site for that is 20 CSR 4240-2.090  
2 Section 6 for anyone who's unfamiliar with that. The  
3 procedural conference today we wanted to discuss  
4 Senate Bill 4 potential hearing dates and a procedural  
5 schedule the jurisdiction of the Commission has set  
6 out in the complaint, and we are not here to address  
7 outside lawsuits of any kind, matters not covered  
8 under the Commission's jurisdiction, federal agency  
9 issues or actions. We don't yet have a hearing date  
10 set for this, but we don't have any available hearing  
11 dates until the end of August through October. Are  
12 there any questions at the moment? Okay. Do we have  
13 any pending motions that anyone wants to discuss? All  
14 right. I -- I'd like you all to discuss, particularly  
15 Evergy, if your view of the case has changed in regard  
16 to the passing of Senate Bill 4 which has been passed  
17 into law.

18 MR. STEINER: No. I don't believe so, Your  
19 Honor.

20 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Okay. How about for  
21 Evergy Missouri West?

22 MR. STEINER: Same.

23 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Are you -- you're  
24 familiar with the provisions of Senate Bill 4 which  
25 change large load capacity?

1 MR. STEINER: Not every provision, but I  
2 think the relief we're asking for is -- is still the  
3 same. You mention a complaint, Your Honor. I  
4 don't -- I'm not aware of that either, so.

5 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Well, this is an  
6 application, not a consumer complaint.

7 MR. STEINER: No. No. You mentioned it.  
8 I -- it is an application, you're right. So I don't  
9 think there's a claim, and I don't think the -- I  
10 don't think the Senate Bill 4 would change the relief  
11 we're asking for.

12 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Okay. So you don't  
13 agree that it's a matter of law some of the portions  
14 of your application are changed by Senate Bill 4?

15 MR. STEINER: I -- I guess I'm -- if it is,  
16 I'll have to review it. I don't -- I'm not aware of  
17 it, so.

18 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Okay. Mr. Pringle, do  
19 you have any thoughts on that? Lexi, do you have  
20 anything to say?

21 MR. PRINGLE: Not at this time. Based on  
22 SB-4's passage, Judge.

23 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Okay. Just so we're  
24 clear that SB-4 has been signed into law and will go  
25 into effect August 28th, and I anticipate that the

1 hearing will happen after the bill goes into effect.

2 MR. CLIZER: Your Honor?

3 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Yes.

4 MR. CLIZER: This is John Clizer on behalf  
5 of OPC, and I do acknowledge that Senate Bill 4  
6 include the provision modification to Section 393.130  
7 Subsection 7 or rather, the addition of Subsection 7  
8 with the addition of requirements for electric  
9 corporations that would meet Evergy's size to provide  
10 tariff relief establishing large load customers. I  
11 think that might be what you're primarily considering  
12 in terms of the impact that SB-4 would have on the  
13 current application, and obviously, the Office of  
14 Public Counsel be considering the implication of that  
15 provision as it relates to this request, but I also  
16 echo, I think, what has been put forward by counsel  
17 for Evergy that I don't think that this necessarily  
18 changes their request. Although, the component isn't  
19 maybe incorporated into that request as part of the  
20 analysis; does that make sense?

21 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Thank you for that.  
22 Okay. Given that, that -- everyone has the same --  
23 seems to have the same thoughts about Senate Bill 4  
24 that things we need to discuss are both potential  
25 hearing dates and a procedural schedule, there is a

1 procedural schedule by the data center, DCC, that's  
2 been put forth, if anyone else would like to propose a  
3 procedural schedule, I'd like to give you a different  
4 deadline for that. Is there anyone who wants any  
5 input on the procedural schedule?

6 MR. STEINER: Your Honor, I think it makes  
7 sense to -- for the Commission to set a date for a  
8 joint procedural schedule to be held maybe not  
9 tomorrow or maybe need a little bit of time to work it  
10 out, but. That would make sense to get something  
11 that's typical in cases like this. The Commission  
12 says file your procedural schedule by -- by X. It'll  
13 be a joint -- or if people couldn't agree, they would  
14 do their own procedural schedule, so. Like, in the  
15 next week or so, that's what I'm proposing. I don't  
16 know if, Travis, do -- would that be workable from  
17 staff's per --

18 MR. PRINGLE: I think based on just kind of  
19 talking like we already have, by the end of the week  
20 on Friday, I think that's -- that's a possibility.

21 MR. STEINER: That works.

22 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Well, just so we're  
23 clear, I'm not going to order you to do it by Friday.  
24 Given -- particularly, given that here staff counsel  
25 is down three attorneys, and I know that Lexi's doing



1 the work of many attorneys and that we won't have a  
2 hearing date until after August. I anticipate a  
3 longer time, a couple of weeks, to produce a  
4 procedural schedule. I'd also like to emphasize that  
5 in adjudication we're trying to get procedural  
6 schedules that people actually stick to. So please,  
7 when you send me a procedural schedule, send me  
8 deadlines that you can meet because I am not inclined  
9 to extend them.

10 So how about hearing dates? I'd like --  
11 I'd like everyone who is participating in this case to  
12 send me hearing dates, and we're looking at August and  
13 going forward, and -- I mean, the end of August, so.

14 MR. STEINER: So -- so Judge, is the  
15 Commission's calendar on the Internet that we can go  
16 by on the availability of the Commission for hearings?

17 LAW JUDGE WALKER: I don't -- I'm not sure  
18 what you have access to. Do you have access to the  
19 calendar of the Commission for hearings that are  
20 already set?

21 MR. STEINER: That's all I have -- it's a  
22 public document that's on the -- on the Commission's  
23 website that sets.

24 MR. PRINGLE: Staff has more robust access.

25 MR. STEINER: Oh, okay. Good to know.

1                   LAW JUDGE WALKER: I'm certain that's the  
2 case, Travis, but.

3                   MR. PRINGLE: Yeah. Yeah.

4                   LAW JUDGE WALKER: Given there are seven  
5 intervenors in this case who don't have that access.

6                   MR. PRINGLE: And Judge, just one quick  
7 thing on the August dates, is there a certain week in  
8 August we start looking at, that week of like the  
9 third week in August and afterwards or is there -- or  
10 just no parts of August? What's the best for the  
11 Commission?

12                   LAW JUDGE WALKER: Well, for the Commission  
13 at the moment there are no available dates until the  
14 end of August, and I would like to have this hearing  
15 after Senate Bill 4 goes into effect which is  
16 August 28th --

17                   MR. PRINGLE: Okay.

18                   LAW JUDGE WALKER: -- because then we won't  
19 have a decision that is not conversant with the  
20 current law in the State of Missouri. Those are the  
21 two, really, three issues for me. Does anyone have  
22 anything else they would like to discuss? Any  
23 concerns?

24                   MR. CARO: Not from Google, Judge.

25                   LAW JUDGE WALKER: Okay. All right. I

1 will issue an order asking you for a procedural  
2 schedule and asking for potential hearing dates from  
3 all of you.

4 MR. PRINGLE: And Judge, will this line  
5 still be on after we go off the record, so the parties  
6 can keep talking about dates?

7 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Of course.

8 MR. PRINGLE: Okay.

9 MR. STEINER: So Judge, if we could  
10 (inaudible) that the SB-4 doesn't really affect our  
11 application, would you -- would the Commission be open  
12 to having a hearing, like, the week of August 18th?

13 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Well, sure. We'd be  
14 open to it, but we don't have an open calendar.

15 MR. STEINER: Okay. I -- again, I may be  
16 going on a non-robust calendar. I thought August 18th  
17 was open. So I'll check with staff.

18 LAW JUDGE WALKER: I think there are a  
19 couple of dates in August that are open. But the way  
20 the process works is, we have to have -- I propose a  
21 hearing date, and then we have to determine that both  
22 the schedule is clear, not only of hearings, but also  
23 procedural and discovery conferences that the rooms  
24 are available, that I am available, and that all the  
25 commissioners are available.

1 MR. STEINER: Okay. That's why you're  
2 asking for hearing dates ahead of time.

3 LAW JUDGE WALKER: It is.

4 MR. STEINER: Got it.

5 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Because I'm going to  
6 take what you give me and mesh it with all of those  
7 other factors. All right. Thank you all. And I  
8 will --

9 MR. CARO: Thank you, Judge.

10 LAW JUDGE WALKER: -- end and let you talk.

11 MR. PRINGLE: Thank you, Judge.

12 LAW JUDGE WALKER: Okay.


