ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri filed a tariff revision on March 27, 2015, to amend its Energy Efficiency Investment Charge Rider tariff to implement a previously-approved exemption for qualifying low-income customers. The exemption was part of a stipulation and agreement approved by the Commission on March 19 in Ameren Missouri's rate case, ER-2014-0258. The tariff revision carries a May 27 effective date.

The Commission's Staff filed its recommendation regarding the tariff on April 27. Staff concludes that the tariff complies with the approved stipulation and agreement, and recommends the tariff be approved to become effective on May 27. No other party filed a recommendation.

The Commission has reviewed the proposed tariff, Ameren Missouri's testimony in support of the tariff, and Staff's recommendation. The Commission finds that the proposed tariff should be approved.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The proposed tariff filed on March 27, 2015, by Union Electric Company, d/b/a

Ameren Missouri, assigned Tracking Number JE-2015-0290 and bearing an effective date of May 27, 2015, is approved to become effective on May 27, 2015. The tariff sheets approved are:
