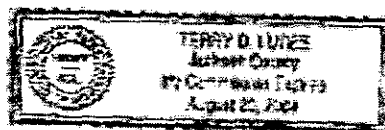

3 **Q. WHAT ARE THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF MS. ROSS?**

4 A. Ms. Ross recommends that Aquila implement an experimental low-income  
5 weatherization program in the Sedalia area.

6 **Q. WHAT ARE THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF MS. RANDOLPH?**

7 A. Ms. Randolph recommends instituting a number of programs and/or  
8 expenditures that she believes will benefit low-income, residential and  
9 commercial customers.

10 **Q. WHAT IS AQUILA'S POSITION REGARDING THESE**  
11 **RECOMMENDATIONS?**

12 A. Aquila is willing to discuss each of these recommendations and programs  
13 with the MDNR and other interested parties outside of this rate case  
14 proceeding. Some of these programs may establish new social programs that  
15 may or may not be in alignment with the view of this Commission. Each of  
16 these programs bears a cost, some of which are substantial, and a clear  
17 determination of cost recovery and cost assignment should be made.  
18 Because of these uncertainties, we do not believe that these  
19 recommendations should be a part of this natural gas rate case, but should  
20 await a dedicated review by this Commission.

21 **Q. IS AQUILA COMMITTED TO PROVIDING LOW COST OR NO COST**  
22 **WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE TO LOW INCOME RESIDENTIAL**  
23 **CUSTOMERS AND SUPPORTING COST EFFECTIVE ENERGY**  
24 **EFFICIENCY PROGRAMS?**

1 A. Aquila is currently providing low cost or no cost weatherization assistance to  
2 low-income residential electric customers and supports several programs that  
3 promote energy efficiency in Missouri. Aquila plans to continue support of  
4 those programs in the future.

5 **Q. WHAT SPECIFIC TYPES OF PROGRAMS RELATED TO ENERGY**  
6 **EFFICIENCY DOES AQUILA CURRENTLY SUPPORT?**

7 A. Aquila's Customer Finance Program offers MPS and L+P residential  
8 customers the opportunity to purchase and receive the advantages of an  
9 energy-efficient heat pump or condensing unit-the majority of which average  
10 11.8 to 13.2 Seasonal Energy Efficiency Ratio ("SEER") well above the  
11 national average of 10 SEER. Aquila also provides energy audits to  
12 residential, commercial and industrial electric customers thereby aiding them  
13 in identifying ways to improve their energy efficiency. The Residential  
14 Lighting Program allows customers to buy compact fluorescent lamps at a  
15 competitive price. Aquila is a founding member of the Heartland Utilities for  
16 Energy Efficiency ("HUEE") which is a utility coalition formed to promote  
17 energy efficiency in the Greater Kansas City marketplace through energy  
18 education, resources and actions to help assure a secure energy future for  
19 area residents.

20 **Q. WHAT TYPES OF LOW-COST OR NO-COST WEATHERIZATION**  
21 **PROGRAMS DOES AQUILA CURRENTLY PROVIDE TO LOW-INCOME**  
22 **CUSTOMERS?**

23 A. Aquila provides funding for specific energy efficient electric measures such  
24 as compact fluorescent lights, home insulation, devices to reduce domestic

1 hot water consumption and other cost effective end use equipment. Funds  
2 are provided when electric energy efficient measures have been installed.  
3

4 **Q. WHY ARE ONLY LOW-INCOME ELECTRIC CUSTOMERS ELIGIBLE**  
5 **UNDER AQUILA'S CURRENT LOW INCOME WEATHERIZATION**  
6 **PROGRAM?**

7 A. Aquila's Low Income Program was developed and implemented as a result  
8 of a Joint Agreement in 1998 between Aquila, Staff and Public Counsel with  
9 regards to Aquila's Electric Resource Plan. The requirements of this Joint  
10 Agreement addressed only electric customers of Aquila in Missouri. Aquila  
11 has complied with the stipulations as outlined in the Joint Agreement.

12 **Q. IS AQUILA IMPLEMENTING ALL COST EFFECTIVE MEASURES IN ITS**  
13 **CURRENT LOW-INCOME WEATHERIZATION PROGRAM?**

14 A. Yes.

15 **Q. WHAT OTHER ENERGY EFFICIENCY PROGRAMS HAS AQUILA**  
16 **DEVELOPED TO DEMONSTRATE ITS CONCERN FOR LOW-INCOME**  
17 **CUSTOMERS?**

18 A. Aquila's Habitat for Humanity Program offers financial incentives to  
19 Missouri Habitat for Humanity affiliates for installing energy efficient  
20 measures. Rebate incentives are available for compact fluorescent lamps,  
21 tank and pipe wrap, low flow showerheads, kitchen aerators and attic  
22 insulation.
