## ORDER EXTENDING TIME TO RESPOND

Issue Date: September 15, 2020

Effective Date: September 15, 2020

A provision in the Commission's electric utility resource planning rule, 20 CSR 4240-22.080(4), requires Missouri's electric utilities to consider and analyze special contemporary issues in their triennial compliance filings or in their annual update reports. The regulation requires the Commission to issue an order by November 1 of each year, specifying the list of special contemporary issues each electric utility is to address. The regulation also provides that by September 15, Staff, Public Counsel, and other interested parties may file suggested issues for consideration. The regulation then allows the utilities and other parties until October 1 to file comments regarding the suggested issues.

On September 14, 2020, the Office of the Public Counsel, filed a motion asking that the dates for filing proposed issues and the time for responses by Evergy Missouri Metro be extended by one week. That would mean that proposed issues would be filed by September 22, with responses filed by October 8. Public Counsel's motion represents that Staff and Evergy Missouri Metro are amenable to the proposed extensions.

The Commission will grant Public Counsel's motion. Of course, if any stakeholder wishes to file proposed issues or responses before the extended due dates they may do so.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. Any stakeholder wishing to suggest a special contemporary issue that Everygy Missouri Metro should consider in its next annual update report shall file its written suggestions no later than September 22, 2020.
2. Everygy Missouri Metro shall file its response to the suggested special contemporary issues by October 8, 2020.
3. Any other person or entity wishing to respond to the special contemporary issues suggested for Everygy Missouri Metro may do so by October 8, 2020.
4. This order shall be effective when issued.
