# ORDER ADOPTING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE AND FURTHER SUSPENDING TARIFF

On November 17, 2000, Laclede Gas Company (Laclede) made a tariff filing to implement an experimental Fixed Price Plan and other modifications to its Gas Supply Incentive Plan. The Commission issued an order suspending the tariff on December 14, 2000. The tariff was suspended for a period of 120 days, to April 17, 2001, unless otherwise ordered by the Commission.

On January 29, 2001, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff) filed a Joint Proposed Procedural Schedule on behalf of Staff, Laclede, and the Office of the Public Counsel (Public Counsel). In addition to providing a proposed procedural schedule, Staff states that the parties agree that Data Request responses shall be due in ten days, and that working papers will be delivered by hand to the other parties within two days of the testimony filing.

The Commission has reviewed the proposed procedural schedule and finds it to be generally appropriate with two modifications. Due to a conflict with the Commission's schedule, the hearing will be scheduled for June 18, 2001. In addition, Laclede will be directed to file its direct testimony no later than February 22, 2001.

- (A) The Commission will require the prefiling of testimony as defined in 4 CSR 240-2.130. All parties shall comply with this rule, including the requirement that testimony be filed on line-numbered pages. The practice of prefiling testimony is designed to give parties notice of the claims, contentions and evidence in issue and to avoid unnecessary objections and delays in the proceedings caused by allegations of unfair surprise at the hearing.
- (B) Pursuant to 4 CSR 240-2.130(15), testimony and schedules shall not be filed under seal and treated as proprietary or highly confidential unless the Commission has first established a protective order. Any testimony or schedule filed without a protective order first being established shall be considered public information.
- (C) The parties shall agree on and file a list of issues to be determined herein by the Commission. Staff shall be responsible for actually drafting and filing the list of issues and the other parties shall cooperate with Staff in the development thereof. Any issue not included in the issues list will be presumed to not require determination by the Commission.
- (D) Each party shall file a list of the witnesses to appear on each day of the hearing and the order in which they shall be called. The parties shall establish the order of cross-examination and file a joint pleading indicating the same.
- (E) Each party shall file a statement of its position on each disputed issue, including a summary of the factual and legal points relied on by the party. Such statement shall be simple and concise, shall follow the issues set out in the issues list, and shall not contain argument about why the party believes its position to be the correct one. The position statement shall be filed in both paper form and electronically, either on computer disk or by e-mail. Electronically-submitted documents shall be in

Word, WordPerfect, or ASCII format. The Regulatory Law Judge's e-mail address is: yruth@mail.state.mo.us.

- (F) The Commission's general policy provides for the filing of the transcript within two weeks after the hearing. If any party seeks to expedite the filing of the transcript, such request shall be tendered in writing to the regulatory law judge at least five days prior to the date of the hearing.
- (G) All pleadings, briefs and amendments shall be filed in accordance with 4 CSR 240-2.080. The briefs to be submitted by the parties shall follow the same list of issues as filed in the case. The briefs must set forth and cite the proper portions of the record concerning the remaining unresolved issues that are to be decided by the Commission. Each principal brief shall not exceed 30 pages in length; reply briefs shall not exceed 15 pages in length.
- (H) All parties are required to bring an adequate number of copies of exhibits which they intend to offer into evidence at the hearing. If an exhibit has been prefiled, only three copies of the exhibit are necessary for the court reporter. If an exhibit has not been prefiled, the party offering it should bring, in addition to the three copies for the court reporter, copies for the five Commissioners, the regulatory law judge, and all counsel.
- (I) Data Request responses shall be due in ten days, and working papers shall be delivered by hand to the other parties within two days of the testimony filing.

#### IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. That the following procedural schedule is adopted for this case, subject to the conditions discussed above:

- 3. That the tariff filing made by Laclede Gas Company on November 7, 2000 (Tariff File No. 200100572), initially suspended for a period of 120 days, to April 17, 2001, is suspended for an additional six months, to October 17, 2001.

4. That this order shall become effective on February 25, 2001.
