

Dear David

I am sending this by fax to your office in Jefferson City so it will reach you before action is taken on the proposal by Laclede Gas Co.

When the energy crises occurred, I made a study of my utility charges, because my heating and air conditioning equipment was reaching the end of their projected life. At that time and ever since I have calculated my therms per degree day. These results have consistently been about what my last three months have been. You will note on the attached that these are

01-24-01 to 02-23-01 .2088 (192.1/920) 42-23-01 to 03-26-01 (2001 (149.5/747)

03-26-01 to 04-25-01 .2181 (56.5/259)

We have a gas fired furnace for heating, a gas fired hot water heater, a gas stove for cooking and a gas drier for clothes. Please note that our usage, measured in therms, is 192.1, 149.5 and 56.5, respectively, shows a decreasing usage per month. January 24 to March 26 are obviously heating periods and March 26 to April 25 is a much lower heating period. All other gas uses would be close to the same amount during each of the three months.

Now look at the charge for "average gas cost per therm. These are \$.87144, \$.75311 and \$.73544. The unit cost per therm is highest when we are using our furnace, Lowest when not.


Everyone, now, has an option to use budget billing or not. The former begins during the summer mouths so that one has to prepay for the coming heating bills and thus level their payments. This gives Lacleds Gas an advantage of prepayment for a product they have not yet provided. Fine, if that is what someone wants to knowingly do.

The new proposal by Laclede, if approved, would not be an option. It would also be to the monetary advantage of Luclede and not to the consumer. A historical study of our winters shows that indeed we have Earth Warming. True we had a colder than normal winter last year, but that is the exception, nor the rule. Many more years of mild winters than very cold winters is the norm, I lived in St. Louis since 1918 and I experienced what I just wrote. Therefore, I conclude that only Laclede Gas will benefit from the proposed change.

I believe we should continue to offer Budget Billing, but absolutely not give Laclede the opportunity to determine their rates based on a what if basis. There is no way that they are going

to set rates that make less profit than they do now. Maroin Spice
