The following proceedings began at 1:17 p.m.:

JUDGE HATCHER: Let's go on the record. Today is July 22, 2025. The time is 1:17 p.m. The question and answer portion, which you just participated in, is concluded. If you did attend that, I do hope that you were able to get all of your questions answered.

What we'll do now is start the comment portion of the hearing. The Missouri Public Service Commission has set this time for a local public hearing to give members of the public a chance to comment about Liberty's request for a rate increase. That is in Case No. ER-2024-0261.

My name is Charles Hatcher. I am the Regulatory Law Judge that will oversee this hearing. The Commission regulates the rates charged by public utility companies in Missouri to ensure that those rates are just and reasonable. The Commission also regulates the quality of service and safety of operations of public utilities.

The Commission is made up of five

Commissioners. The Commission's Chair, Kayla Hahn, and

Commissioner John Mitchell are with me here today. Also
in attendance are Commissioners Maida Coleman and Glen

Kolkmeyer. They are on our computer connection and will
be listening online. And there is one vacancy at the

1	moment on the Commission.
2	The Commissioners are appointed by the
3	Governor and confirmed by the Senate. The Commission
4	employs a staff of engineers, accountants, attorneys,
5	financial analysts and other specialists in the field of
6	utility regulation. And Commissioner Mitchell, would
7	you like to make opening comments?
8	COMMISSIONER MITCHELL: Sure. Thank you,
9	Judge. On behalf of the entire Commission, I'd like to
10	welcome you here this afternoon. This is the very first
11	step in this rate proceeding and it's an important step
12	because it's the Commission's really only chance to get
13	to hear directly from you, the customers. And your
14	thoughts and testimony on this matter are very important
15	to us, and I want to assure you that your thoughts and
16	your comments will be taken seriously and taken to heart
17	as we move through this process. So thank you for being
18	here. We genuinely appreciate it.
19	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Commissioner.
20	Let's move to having the parties introduce themselves.
21	First for Liberty.
22	MS. CARTER: Diana Carter for the Empire
23	District Electric Company doing business as Liberty.
24	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. And for the Staff

of the Commission.

1	MR. GRAHAM: Paul Graham for the Staff of the
2	Missouri Public Service Commission.
3	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. And the Office of
4	the Public Counsel.
5	MR. WILLIAMS: Nathan Williams, Chief Deputy
6	Public Counsel, appearing on behalf of the public and
7	the Office of the Public Counsel.
8	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. We did have
9	several intervenors in this case. Did any of those
10	counsel want to introduce themselves on the record? All
11	right. Hearing none.
12	This is a fairly well attended hearing, which
13	is great as the Commission does want to hear from the
14	public, and we also do want to give everyone the
15	opportunity to speak. So I will have to be limiting
16	comments to three minutes each. I currently have a
17	little over 30 persons signed up to comment, and we will
18	need to end the hearing today at three o'clock.
19	The Commission has another hearing in this
20	case, another public comment session, going on tonight.
21	That will start at 6:00. And that is a little over an
22	hour drive away. We also need to get all of the staff
23	and equipment to the next location. So I will be
24	letting everyone know when your three minutes are up.
25	We also have a timer going on in the audience.

After you do come up and give your comments,
I'll ask for you to stay for just a second to see if any
of the Commissioners or counsel have any questions. And
speaking of questions, I did want to let everyone know
that the Commissioners and myself will not be able to
answer questions for you today. That's what the
question and answer portion was for. This is for the
Commissioners to hear your information. But since
they're still deciding the case, they won't be able to
really comment on what your question or your comment
might be, because they need to wait until after all of
the evidence is in and then they'll make an official
ruling on the case.

With that in mind, I will go ahead and start calling names. And I will do my best to read and pronounce your name correctly. I apologize in advance, this happens to me at every hearing, I will accidentally mispronounce some names. The first name I have is Connie Horton. I'm also going to read the next few names so that those persons are ready and we can start getting people up to the microphone. Cheryl Arledge and Leo Arledge are the next two names.

Ms. Horton, I'd like to swear you in first.

Do you solemnly swear or affirm that the testimony
you're about to give will be the truth?

2	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. Please state and
3	spell your name for the court reporter.
4	MS. HORTON: Connie Horton, C-o-n-n-i-e
5	H-o-r-t-o-n.
6	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Ms. Horton. Please
7	go ahead and give your comments.
8	MS. HORTON: My comments mainly have to do
9	with the utilities that my daughter has. I also am
10	you can't hear?
11	JUDGE HATCHER: Yes. Can we get the back
12	doors closed. It's a little hard to hear in here.
13	These microphones are a little special. You have to
14	kind of direct
15	MS. HORTON: Get right on them.
16	JUDGE HATCHER: Yes. You're on. I will
17	restart your three minutes. Go ahead.
18	MS. HORTON: My daughter lives out towards the
19	Sparta area. I also have a home out towards Sparta. My
20	daughter's utility bills for the winter were really high
21	and she had her thermostat set at 58 degrees. Her bill
22	came in at, let me look real quick, \$435 at a 58 degree
23	temperature. I ended up spending \$400 myself on wood
24	just so that she could run her wood stove. She ended up

sleeping in the living room. And she does have

1	insulation and everything in her house. We could not
2	understand why her bill was so high. And if you
3	increase this by 30, 40 percent, she said she would go
4	ahead and just basically turn off her furnace. It's a
5	brand new furnace. New electric, new furnace,
6	everything. But she said I cannot afford it, mom. She
7	said I'm going to have to just heat with wood this
8	winter.
9	So for the young people and the people that
10	are retired with a fixed income, house payments or rent,
11	they cannot afford 40 percent, 30 percent. I understand
12	a little bit to keep things up, but this is a little bit
13	on the outrageous side. That's all I have to say.
14	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Mrs. Horton. Were
15	there any questions for Ms. Horton? Hearing none.
16	Thank you. I appreciate you being here today. And
17	Cheryl Arledge. I'm sorry.
18	MS. ARLEDGE: Yes. I'm here representing my
19	little food bank in Sparta, Missouri.
20	JUDGE HATCHER: Before you get started, let me
21	swear you in real quick. Do you solemnly swear or
22	affirm that the testimony you're about to give will be
23	the truth?
24	MS. ARLEDGE: Yes sir.
25	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. Please state and



1 | spell your name for our court reporter.

MS. ARLEDGE: It's Cheryl Arledge, C-h-e-r-y-l A-r-l-e-d-q-e.

JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. Please go ahead with your comment.

MS. ARLEDGE: Okay. Well, I'm here representing my little food bank in Sparta. It's out of the Hope of Sparta Church. I'm the director there. And as many of you have heard the least of these commercials they serve about 900 families a month. Our little church takes on some of the overspill from them who don't have proper paperwork or whatever. So we serve anywhere from 50 to 100 families a month, on average anywhere from five to seven people in those families, which we're self-funded.

And I'm thinking if we have this kind of a rate increase, I don't see how any of these people are going to afford 30 to 40 percent. We're not exactly hurting, but 30, 40 percent is going to take a dent in our wallets too. It's also going to put more stress on our tiny little food bank, which we don't have much of a budget because we are a small church. And I'm afraid I'm going to have to be telling people I'm sorry, I can't give you any food because we just don't have any left. I don't want to do that to anybody. I take it

1	out of my own cabinet to provide food for some of these
2	families because sometimes you know they don't have
3	anything. It makes me almost cry some of these people
4	that we go to see and how they're living. I just don't
5	see how any of them are going to afford this. And I
6	don't want to see it hurt the kind of help that we are
7	trying to provide to the community. So that's that.
8	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Ms. Arledge. I
9	appreciate you being here today to share that with us.
LO	Mr. Arledge. Let me swear you in. Do you solemnly
L1	swear or affirm that the testimony you're about to give
L2	will be the truth?
L3	MR. ARLEDGE: I do.
L4	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. Please state and
L5	spell your name for our court reporter.
L6	MR. ARLEDGE: Leo Arledge, L-e-o
L7	A-r-l-e-d-g-e. The lady before me just happens to be my
L8	wife. Okay. I am an alderman for Ward 1 of Sparta. As
L9	such, I already know people are struggling to pay their
20	utility bills in Sparta. If you raise this 40 percent,
21	it is going to force people to choose between cooling or
22	heat, eating or not eating. And as far as the ladies
23	were saying that the electricity would bring more
24	business, we all know electricity does not bring in
25	business. Gas, natural gas will bring in business.



1	Electricity at this point is a stopgap measure
2	for Sparta. If you raise it, you will kill a lot of
3	small businesses in Sparta because they will not be able
4	to afford it. And we don't have that much anyway.
5	Questions?
6	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. I appreciate that.
7	I wasn't ready for that, Mr. Arledge. I appreciate
8	that. Were there any questions? Hearing none. Thank
9	you. I appreciate you coming out today. We have Jeanne
LO	McFall, Audrey Grobe. I apologize. And then Seth
L1	Ramming. Ms. McFall. Thank you. I'll swear you in.
L2	Do you solemnly swear or affirm that the testimony
L3	you're about to give will be the truth?
L4	MS. McFALL: Yes.
L5	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. If you could state
L6	and spell your name for the record.
L7	MS. McFALL: Jeanne McFall, J-e-a-n-n-e
L8	M-c-F-a-l-l. I think my main concern today is with the
L9	39 percent, almost 40 percent increase. We are here in
20	Nixa. Nixa is a supplier of electricity, not Empire in
21	this area or Liberty. Their rate is .10980. What we
22	are looking to have if this would go through is .19531
23	which is almost double of what somebody living in the
24	city of Nixa is paying today.
25	The Missouri average is .1289 and that's on



City Utilities website. So we're looking at almost double what other regions are paying. So that's something to take into consideration why do we need that big of increase.

I think the biggest problem I've had with Liberty in the last -- since April, they did electronic meters, they changed their computer system, their billing system is out of line. They have not corrected these issues. They do have a new administrator that was hired three weeks ago, but I did make a request prior to this meeting to get the outages that I've experienced on my meter within the last year. That wasn't available until 12:11 today. That took over a month to get that information because my meter wouldn't recognize that.

I have called in for outages at least three times in the last year. The last time I was on hold for 45 minutes because it didn't recognize my phone number. Come to find out my phone number wasn't acceptable because nobody had checked the box that said USA in front of it. That's a computer issue, not mine. That's a company issue. I have been at the same address all but one year of my life. My phone hasn't changed. My location hasn't changed. The company has changed.

And they need to look at the billing issues, the extra postage that they have charged, the extra

1	customer service time that's been involved, and now
2	we're having to pay for it because of that. The last
3	meeting I attended was at Ozark, which was a different
4	issue than the rate increase. But we have nine
5	streetlights that were out that evening when I went
6	home. Those nine streetlights are still out on 3rd and
7	South Street. They are not taking care of business.
8	The future development in Ozark is looking at
9	other utility companies. The new development across
LO	from Walmart is going with White River Electric. The
L1	new development behind James River Assemblies of God is
L2	looking at Ozark Electric. They are not wanting to use
L3	the electric company. Thank you.
L4	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. I appreciate that.
L5	I appreciate everybody being here and showing their
L6	support. If we can maybe hold off on the applause, that
L7	gets us through the witnesses a little faster so that
L8	all of your neighbors can have their say. Ms. Grobe.
L9	Thank you, ma'am. If you would let me swear you in. Do
20	you solemnly swear or affirm that the testimony you are
21	about to give will be the truth?
22	MS. GROBE: Yes.
23	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. And if you could
24	please state and spell your name for our court reporter.

JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Ms. Grobe. Please go ahead.

MS. GROBE: I'm a resident of Ozark, have been for about four years. One of my comments is you're asking for more money but I am still paying for a 2007 storm that occurred when my house was not even built. There are hundreds of other houses that were built since then. That tells me you've been getting paid for a storm that happened in 2007 for 18 years, and there are hundreds of more houses that are paying that. Why are you needing more money? That shouldn't even be on my bill now. That's just crazy.

And you told me earlier that you were putting in a new program where you're going to pay people who have not been able to pay their bill. Well, who's paying that? We are. That's not fair. I just happen to be a senior citizen. I worked for 52 years before I retired. I am on a fixed income. I get a 2-1/2 percent raise. You're asking for 30. Inflation is not near that. Why do you think that you need that much money? You don't. You need to run your business better.

I can give you an example of a place where you didn't run your business well at all. We had three trees behind our fence that were in the lines. Your



1	people come out and they trimmed the top of them out.
2	We told them you can take the tree out so you don't have
3	to come back. Oh, no, we can't do that. We paid \$3,000
4	to get those trees taken out and it was your
5	responsibility. Thank you.
6	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Ms. Grobe. I
7	appreciate you being here and bringing your comments.
8	Seth Ramming.
9	MR. RAMMING: Yes.
10	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, sir. I was hoping
11	I would pronounce it correctly. Do you solemnly swear
12	or affirm that the testimony you're about to give will
13	be the truth?
14	MR. RAMMING: I do.
15	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. And would you
16	please state and spell your name for the court reporter.
17	MR. RAMMING: My name is Seth Ramming, S-e-t-h
18	R-a-m-m-i-n-g.
19	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. Please go ahead
20	with your comments.
21	MR. RAMMING: I'm a 27-year-old resident of
22	the city of Sparta. I live in I own a home there in
23	the 25 percent sector that Liberty Utility owns. When I
24	saw this paper here, I was immediately ready to see what
25	I can do to switch over to White River Electric Company.



1 I'm just going to call it what it is. This is absolute 2 price gouging through and through. I mean, 40 percent. 3 You're looking at an average of what most people 4 actually get in their wage increases is about 3 to 6 5 This is really just a lot. Here I'm closer to 6 the PSC staff recommendation. Personally I agree with the Office of Public Counsel that there shouldn't be any 7 8 increase.

The \$3 fuel transfer fee that they're talking about here over on the next page I do agree with.

That's only a \$3 increase. That doesn't bother me too much. But personally I'm more on the side of PSC Staff recommendations. That's more equitable.

Sparta is a town of 2,000 people. There's a lot of low income people. There's a lot of disabled people. There's a lot of people who are on social security. There's basically low income. Personally I don't really feel like this is actually going to do very well for people who live there, nor do I really feel like it's going to do well for business. When we talk about something like this, we have to consider not only the residents but we have to consider the economy. I don't really feel like this is going to do well for the economy.

I'm not here to argue. I'm not here to make

1	outrageous claims or debate with anyone. This is just
2	how it is. God bless the people in Missouri. God bless
3	the United States.
4	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Mr. Ramming. I
5	appreciate you being here. Let me go ahead and call the
6	next few names. I believe it's spelled M-i-r-e Batz,
7	B-a-t-z. And then a Kathy Coons and then Rick Hagan.
8	Does that first name ring a bell to anyone? It sure
9	looks like the last name starts with a B. I'll circle
10	back around. Ms. Coons, please go ahead and step up to
11	the microphone. I will swear you in. Do you solemnly
12	swear or affirm that the testimony you're about to give
13	will be the truth?
14	MS. COONS: I do.
15	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. If you would
16	please state and spell your name for the court reporter.
17	MS. COONS: My name is Kathy Coons, K-a-t-h-y
18	C-o-o-n-s.
19	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Ms. Coons. Please
20	go ahead with your comment.
21	MS. COONS: I think the question is why a
22	company that gives its CEO and top executives large
23	compensation packages, has shown good profits for the
24	past several years, who has spent money on acquisitions

25

and buying back of stock shares would need to force such

a large increase on its captive customer base.

Any company with a non-captive customer base would lose its clients to the competition. Good recent examples would be cell phone, TV and internet companies, all of which have been forced to change their strategies due to customer loss over their incessant price increases. Logically customer base growth should cover some cost increases in the long term. Certainly Southwest Missouri it has and is seeing such growth.

I feel I know that Liberty is asking for more than they expect to get. If the rate increase is reduced somewhat, we're all supposed to feel like we got something, but truly this rate increase is an abuse of the captive customer base and the large increase request is unwarranted for a company with the strong financial position.

Let them do some of the sacrificing we are being forced to take the full brunt of. When is a decent profit going to be enough. In my opinion that will be never. That's why we have to rely on you to protect the interests of us, the captive customer. Thank you.

JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Ms. Coons. I appreciate you being here. Rick Hagan. The next couple names are Darlene Nap and Katie Medcalf. Mr. Hagan, let

Thev 13 only stipulated for Empire District that last year they 14 had a profit of \$116 million is what she stated and you 15 guys had also stated that they had done their updates to 16 the dam and to one of the generating plants or two of 17 the generating plants. 18 You're wanting to upgrade substations and 19 stuff now. If you made a profit of that on top of all 20 the expense last year, why can't you do that every year. 21 I mean, you're wanting another, almost another 153 2.2 million on top of that. That will give you -- starting 23 next year that will give you -- if you stayed on that 2.4 same track, that would give you a profit of over \$300

million a year. You can't put some of that in a savings

1	account and pay for some of your own expenses? I have
2	to do that for my house. I just don't understand why
3	you guys think you need that big of an increase.
4	The rest of you guys you're sitting there,
5	turn around and look at that screen. It says Missouri
6	Public Service Commission. You're here to protect the
7	public. And if you guys approve them having this
8	increase, you're not serving the public. That's my
9	opinion and everybody's entitled to that. You guys
10	really seriously need to think about who you are
11	representing or who you're supposed to be representing.
12	Thank you. Any questions for me?
13	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Mr. Hagan. I don't
14	hear any. Appreciate you coming out today. Darlene
15	Nap. Thank you, ma'am. Please come on down. I will
16	swear you in. Do you solemnly swear or affirm that the
17	testimony you're about to give will be the truth?
18	MS. NAP: Yes.
19	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. And if you would
20	please state and spell your name for the record.
21	MS. NAP: Darlene Nap, simple, N-a-p.
22	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Ms. Nap. Please go
23	ahead with your comments.
24	MS. NAP: Thank you for the opportunity to
25	speak. I was at the townhall meeting in Ozark. My



question is without really an answer how is it that you want to go ahead and request an increase in rates yet we haven't even addressed because it's under investigation for all the billing errors, not just about late billing combined but about huge erroneous billings.

I had an \$800 bill combined in four days. I moved into the apartment in January. So January bill is 398, and the February bill is 297. It's just me living I'm working 12-hour shifts as there. I'm hardly there. All that said and done, I'm told oh, check a nurse. your appliances. It's a brand new facility at Finley Ridae. That's why I moved there. Then they'd be like oh, it's maybe the meter. Nobody ever came to look at the meter until I went to the town meeting. Then, of course, they immediately set that up and somebody came He didn't explain to me how the meter works. out.

I understand some things about a meter because I moved from Colorado to Missouri by choice. Well, that was my choice. I planned it for six years. Then I arrive. But I'm thinking about when we had this employee here from Texas when I was in Colorado, I know you guys would know about that with the meter changes issues that happened in Texas, and then Colorado was bombarded with serious increased rates when they put their meters in and now I'm seeing all this going on

with all this talk.

The rates were double, triple, just like my electric bill was tripled even though we didn't have -- maybe we had the new meters put in. I don't know. I moved here last year. All that said and done, yeah, having brought her in from Texas from three weeks ago, I took note of that. You're asking for a rate increase. Then you have this. Again, I went through all of that in Colorado last year.

In closing, I'm 65. I'm not retired but I'm on social security for a death. So therefore social security does limit my income. Yes, I already received a letter from them for not being a hero but having to be stuck working as a nurse because agency didn't show up due to no show, no call. Now I've got to pay half of that back for the couple extra shifts I was kind of forced to work because I can't leave my patients. That would be neglect.

Okay. Moving right along, I am on limited income. And looking at all of this, do I really want to stay in Ozark? No. I've already researched. I can only work part time again with the limited income restrictions. I can make \$1,900 a month. Oh, okay. Let me just give up my salary for \$1,900 a month and live off of beans and rice. I did all that with the

1	Ramsey, David Ramsey method and paid off my debt. Now
2	I'm in debt again. I'm going backwards instead of
3	forward.
4	Nursing homes have issues which we're not
5	going to talk about but because of Medicare and Medicaid
6	and staffing issues and stuff like that, but we're not
7	able to do anything to address those issues. But we
8	have to do something to give Liberty a rate increase? I
9	don't get a rate increase as a nurse. I'm making \$10
10	less an hour. All that said and done, it's just a
11	thought and process. Thank you. Good day.
12	JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Ms. Medcalf. I
13	appreciate you being here today. We do have a question
14	for you. Mr. Williams.
15	MR. WILLIAMS: It's just a quick one. You
16	mentioned January and February. You didn't indicate
17	which year.
18	MS. NAP: This year. I moved into the
19	apartment in January. December 30 I signed a lease just
20	to lock it in. I paid a month in January for a Nixa
21	apartment just to give myself time to pack and purge
22	everything.
23	MR. WILLIAMS: Have you had any billing issues
24	since then?
25	MS. NAP: I didn't after March I mean. So



1	that was January, February. After March. After March
2	it was like \$50 a month, 52.

25	to know that my electric is going to be turned off. I'm



1	not a bad payer. I'm not behind on anything. I have a
2	great credit score. But I couldn't pay. I was not able
3	to physically pay them because I couldn't get online.
4	It was not possible. I called month after month.
5	They're like you're on our list. We'll get to you.
6	Nobody has touched it. Nobody has touched it after
7	every month. I'm like I just want to pay. I'd gone
8	into the office and paid them, but I wasn't able to see
9	where my payments had come in. So that was really
10	frustrating. But to find out that you guys are planning
11	on, I looked this morning on the websites, which
12	Liberty, by the way, they're not transparent.
13	Unfortunately it's the worst website to find. They
14	didn't give me their rates. But the rest of them, White
15	River Valley, Ozark Electric Co-op, Webster, these are
16	my coworkers. This is what they have. They're like
17	they're great.
18	They're paying 12 cents a kilowatt, 10 cents a
19	kilowatt. I looked today 10 cents a kilowatt for
20	Webster. Even City Utilities is 11 cents. We're paying
21	14 to 16 cents per kilowatt roughly. And this rate
22	increase will be 16 to 22 cents a kilowatt raise. I
23	mean, that's double what they are paying for even the
24	next highest levels. I mean, I won't be able to afford

Ι 16 cannot call it any different because I'm sure nobody in 17 this room gets a 30 or 40 percent raise of anything, not 18 by the bank of interest, not by the employer. 19 There's a lot of people that are on fixed incomes does. 20 and we're being squeezed from all sides. Not just from 21 the electricity, of course.

So bigger picture is I'm thinking I'm doing everything right to conserve. I have to have electricity because it's not where I say I don't have Paramount streaming service, I can live without that. I

cannot live without electricity. And I conserve. But I still get hit with 30, 40 percent. That is just wrong.

I understand everything gets a little bit more expensive. I understand that. There needs to be improvements, which I would love to see some improvements in better energy, clearer energy that doesn't cost so much to get it here. But 30 percent is just over the top and I don't see that it is justified or acceptable.

And hearing what I heard today, it makes perfect sense when we have some shareholders. Let me tell you I worked for the biggest retailer in the country for over 20 years. And when they have their shareholder meetings, they have to tell them okay, we did so much profit but guess how they did it. They lived within their means. They took a look at every cost cutting detail that they can do.

And my question is, and I really question that, that Liberty is doing that with all the issues that went on last year with the billing which I have had not a proper bill since last May until this May I guess. There was months that were skipped and I have no idea what I made or what I used.

And it's all guesswork. So my biggest issue with this is that it's too high and I see no

depends on how much I want to work. Luckily I had the freedom to come here today. I'm sure a lot of people don't because they have to pay their electric bills, you know.

As it is right now, I'm already around \$600 behind on my electric bill. If I get \$1,000 behind on my child support, I lose my license. It takes priority over having electric to me being able to maintain everything. There's certain -- I have to have my excavator to pay for my house. There's certain things that take priority over certain things.

It just gets more and more difficult to keep up with everything especially with the increase on that. It would be kind of hard. I did a couple quick Google searches while I was listening to the question portion of everything and said that the CEOs of Liberty Utilities own 72 percent of the shares for the company and he's worth \$172 million. An average chairperson makes anywhere from 270 to \$313,000 a year. And I feel like it's just kind of like a cash grab. You know, like people like me, I go out and lift retaining wall blocks all day, break my back, whereas somebody in their shoes has the million dollars to invest to make a -- \$10 million to invest and make a million dollars back if they're at their 10 percent they're requesting. That's

Every franchise out there has a volume of people that need to be in your demographic before they'll sell you a million dollar franchise.

I had no clue in a year living in Ozark these rates were going to be this way. I can't get a straight answer when I do call. Can't get them to fix problems. Just went to level pay. They still haven't fixed it. Two months in a row. And then tell me I can call my bank and make sure my bank did it. I'm not paid by Liberty to do that. Please do the job you're paid for.

Please have an easy phone system so I can get a hold of somebody. Truly on top of all that my serious concern is that if the Commission allows Liberty to increase rates this way, our next one will be our gas bill and then it will be our water bill, because I can on everything else. My phone, yeah, I can check. I can work around that. All these other bills I can check. And back when I was on propane a year ago, I could price out my propane companies. I could see who is going to

MR. MONTOYA: I've only been in the area for about three years. Three years ago for some reason one of the winter months, I don't know if it's December's or January's, we had a \$500 bill. Can't figure out why. Every other month even on middle of summer, every other winter month it's 200 bucks. That's great. Got that resolved four months later where they actually give us a free month because we already paid so much.

But we ended up getting solar two years ago.

My average monthly bill, summer, winter, doesn't matter, is about 40 bucks. I think the worst one I had was \$80 except for that same month that that \$500 bill came in and it's still over 300 bucks. And the only answer they gave us, it's a fuel charge.

I'm on solar. I've got 20 panels. If I'm only paying 40 bucks and there's only a 7 degree difference, now my Mexican blood is from Arizona so I have no problem with the heat. And my wife is a cold blooded Missourian who has no problem with cold. But it's, what, a \$300 difference because of fuel. In two years gas hasn't gone up over \$3 a gallon. There's a

problem. And as far as it being resolved, it hasn't.

We keep getting the whole oh, it's a fuel thing, it's a

fuel thing and that's it.

In fact, I was just talking to somebody here. They brought it up to one of their employees. couldn't even find my address. 557 Sunset Street, Sparta, Missouri. Not hard. I'm a gun owner. You guys can all share up. I don't care. But the point is they can't even find my address. They won't resolve the It's an insane markup and they're asking for I'm all down with the whole capitalist thing. Give it to them but let us have somebody else we can choose. Anybody else. I don't care. Anybody.

You know, the whole point of our country is no monopolies is my point here. And I can't -- like I said, Sparta, like the other guy said, I get anybody I've called every other company. They say well, we don't own anything there, we can't help you, we can't give you electricity. I don't know what else to do. Τ can't get off the grid. It's illegal for me to cut the line, put up a windmill to add to my solar. What am I supposed to do? What is anybody here supposed to do? Just I'm also even though I work everyday 10, 12 hours a day, I may just be a Door Dasher, my wife may just work a normal blue collar job making \$16 an hour.

I agreed with the Office of Public Counsel that we really need to make sure we're looking out for the citizens of Missouri and in particular in this case, right, in Southwest Missouri and taking care of them in a manner that they are going to still be able to put food on the table four weeks out of the month, not three out of four. I've been to several of the aldermen meetings and tried to get them to address the streetlight situation in Ozark. Those are supplied and serviced by Liberty Electric, and the city tells us we the people when we go to our representatives and say why do the streetlights not work. Well, we called Liberty Electric and they won't do anything about it.

There's people that can tell you about outage after outage after outage. There would be people that would be much more inclined to not speak against a rate

I currently live in Ozark. We have lived in this area for over 25 years. We've lived in three different states and had lots of different utility companies. And I do have to say that we are Liberty customers for the electric and it is the highest electric bill I've ever paid in my life.

I was going to discuss some billing issues, but I don't feel that that's nearly important as the rest of what needs to be said. I volunteer a lot with social service agencies that are in Christian County. I've had many meetings with Christian County Homeless Alliance and with our local OACAC. If you want statistics and facts, they can give them to you about the homeless population in Christian County and what we call people living on the edge.

I see if this rate increase goes through we're going to have many, many more people on the edge and many, many more homeless that need to be served. And the issue with that is services are already being stretched.

I don't know if you are aware or not but local food banks and local food pantries have suffered a loss

in grants and money that they're able to get from
government sources. Their funding has been cut. So not
only is there an increase right now because of the
economy. But if this horrendous rate increase would go
through, I can't imagine what it would do to those
people that are already homeless and the people that are
just hanging on. There's another word for those people
that are just barely hanging on are called the working
poor.

This could be a young couple with children or people that have just -- people that are just starting out, they're young, or could be senior citizens. They don't have a lot to work with and their budget is being pushed from every possible direction. So you throw something like this at these people and they have no recourse. They make a decision like what's already been said. Am I going to put food on the table or am I going to heat the house.

I went behind a couple Not because there was a lack of money but because they just refused to take my account information.

The other thing was like very pressing. I noticed a power line just laying out in the middle of the street and so, of course, like immediate I'm going to call and say hey, can you guys -- they actually have a direct line where you can press like one or two. It's like if there's a down power line, like press one or two and then they'll take you to the person that will get that taken care of.

So first thing I do is try and get that taken care of. Few months go by. There's still a power line. And you know, she's seven, about to be eight. I teach her how to ride her bicycle. She rides her bicycle on

1 I call two more times. Still nothing. the street. 2 There's just a power line just laying out in the middle 3 of the street. Mind you I have to pay the bills by 4 calling in. I just know that I have 8 direct deposit and I also have a bank account like they 9 just auto draft off my account. Surely enough, you know, I see about a week ago the line has finally been cut and stapled to the power line and I'm looking at it. It is not a cable. It does not go to the -- so I don't have television in my house. We go on lots of walks. That's another thing I'm noticing. We go on a lot of evening walks with me and my daughter.

We live like right downtown Ozark, Missouri.

Why are the streetlights not on, you know? I live in Springfield, City Utilities, which I don't know if you guys heard earlier today the Q&A they charge like a .9 at City Utilities. Over here with Liberty they're charging a 1.3 which is a 30 percent more than the surrounding areas and yet they want to charge 30 percent more on top of that, so 60 percent per kilowatt hour, and they're not even doing their job.

They're not fixing the streetlights. They're not getting live hazardous power lines out of the street. I'm not even sure if it was really Liberty that cut the line and stapled it to the post because I could do that, my neighbor could do that. And there's two other houses in front of me and next door to me that also have children that play in that street. And it's just extremely concerning for the safety and welfare of the children in this city and this county. I just don't feel like that is a concern at all to Liberty.

JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Mr. Barnes. I appreciate that. I don't see any questions for you. Appreciate you coming out today and letting us know about that. Paula Clark. Ms. Clark, let me swear you in. Do you solemnly swear or affirm that the testimony you're about to give will be the truth?

17	community we cannot afford that type of increase. I
18	know when you ask for a 50 cents, maybe you would settle
19	for 30, maybe you'd settle for 20.
20	In this area, we can't wobble like that. We
21	can't be in a state of wondering what will our bill be
22	next month. What will our electricity cost us next
23	year.
24	I know for us, my household personally,
25	there's just the two of us. We didn't turn our air



conditioning on until August of last year because we couldn't afford the electricity. It was like throwing money into the wind when we could use that money for other bills, we could use the money for savings, we could use the money to save for future events that might happen, the car might break down. So we run our household like a business, which I think that Liberty maybe should run their household account a little tighter.

This year because of the heat advisory, they're calling it I believe an extreme heat advisory. We do have our air on. We turned it on in July. Just this month we turned it on.

I have a picture if you want to see it of our thermostat at 11:12 p.m. last night. I took a picture of our thermostat just for this meeting. It's set at 78 degrees at 11:12 last night. I never turn it below 78 because of the cost of the electricity.

Think of the seniors. Think of the young parents in the community that cannot afford an increase like what you're asking for. I do have a question that I cannot figure out what it is, can't find an answer to. On my bill it's called the February 2021 storm and Asbury cost. This has been on my bill for some time now. What is that?

JUDGE HATCHER: Ms. Clark, I appreciate you being here to offer your testimony. I don't see any questions being asked of you. Myself and the Commissioners aren't allowed to answer questions for the same reason that we couldn't be at that question and answer portion because they're still making the decisions. They have to wait for the evidence to come in.

MS. CLARK: That's fine.

JUDGE HATCHER: However, this room is filled with people who can answer that exact question for you. If you would probably stick around to the end of the meeting I'm positive that we can find somebody to help you out with that.

Well, Liberty, they had the ability to do And I would have done the same thing. this. But a lot of guys went there because it was \$10 an hour increase Now, in the utility industry it's built iust for that. If the supervisor sees that the subordinate Okav. gets that kind of increase, then there's always a built-in percentage that you've got to have differential based on HR rules. And so you see that any time that there is an increase in cost, it gets elevated on up. And so those costs are at the discretion of the company in a lot of ways, but yet having good linemen is very much important and of anybody in the utility I respect linemen very much having worked with them guite a bit.
