On November 12-13, 2020, the Commission conducted an evidentiary hearing in the application of Evergy Metro Inc. d/b/a Evergy Missouri Metro and Evergy Missouri West, Inc. d/b/a Evergy Missouri West (collectively "Evergy") for an accounting authority order to govern costs and financial impacts associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.
