# **NOTICE OF CORRECTION**

On September 20, 2001, the Missouri Public Service Commission issued a report and order in this case with an effective date of October 17, 2001. Two paragraphs under the findings of fact in that report and order should be amended to read:

- (4) According to the information on Laclede in Exhibit 18, the current GSIP has not created any significant savings on the demand cost of gas, but has generated large profits for Laclede last winter. The gas procurement mechanism's impact on consumers, according to the information on Laclede in Exhibit 35, is approximately 2 cents per dollar spent on gas. This amount is not significant.
- (5) Allowing Laclede to shift discounts into years where benchmarks are more difficult to meet, at the expense of lowering customers' rates, is not in the ratepayers' interest.



According to the information on Laclede in Exhibit 18, ratepayers are worse off with respect to transportation discounts under the GSIP than they would have been without the GSIP.
