1	Q.	STATE YOUR NAME AND ADDRESS PLEASE.
2	Α.	William C. Eads, 1700 East Sycamore Lane, Springfield, Missouri
3	Q.	BY WHOM ARE YOU EMPLOYED AND IN WHAT CAPACITY?
4	A.	I am employed by the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers ("IBEW") as
5		Vice President of the 11 <sup>th</sup> District, which encompasses the states of Missouri, Iowa,
6		Nebraska, North and South Dakota.
7	Q.	PLEASE STATE YOUR EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND AND PROFESSIONAL
8		EXPERIENCE.
9	А.	I have been employed by the IBEW since 1977 and have had the responsibilities, as
10		Vice President, for the entire district since 1998, I am a high school graduate and have
11		a degree in Mechanical Engineering with minors in Labor Law and Economics, my first
12		experiences in the Utility industry started in 1965 when I became employed by Kansas
13		City Power & Light Company.
14	Q.	PLEASE DESCRIBE THE IBEW, ITS MISSION, DUTIES, RESPONSIBILITIES,

16	A.	The IBEW is a labor union which represents approximately 800,000 members in the

1	Α.	The outcomes of past rate cases have already weakened Empire's financial position.
2		We are concerned that, unless the company's rate and revenue proposal is approved,
3		Empire's financial position will be insufficient to allow the Company to maintain a high
4		level of customer service and to continue to invest in the required level of new
5		construction. We understand that a strong financial position will enable the Company
6		to provide continued infrastructure improvements in generation, transmission, and
7		distribution. These investments will allow the Company to provide quality service to
8		its electric customers in Missouri. We thus support Empire's rate and revenue
9		proposal and ask that it be approved by the Commission.
10	Q.	ASIDE FROM THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH MAINTAINING A HIGH
11		LEVEL OF CUSTOMER SERVICE AND MAKING THE REQUIRED
12		INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENTS, ARE THERE OTHER COST OF SERVICE
13		ITEMS IN EMPIRE'S RATE AND REVENUE PROPOSAL THAT YOU WOULD
14		LIKE TO COMMENT ON?
15	А.	Yes. Empire proposes certain modifications to how the funding of pension-related
16		costs should be accounted for in the company's rates. Adequate funding of Empire's
17		pension current and future expenses is very important to employees represented by the
18		various Locals. We find that Empire's proposed modification is an important step
19		towards ensuring a continuation of adequate funding of pension expenses and strongly
20		recommend that the Commission approve the proposal.
