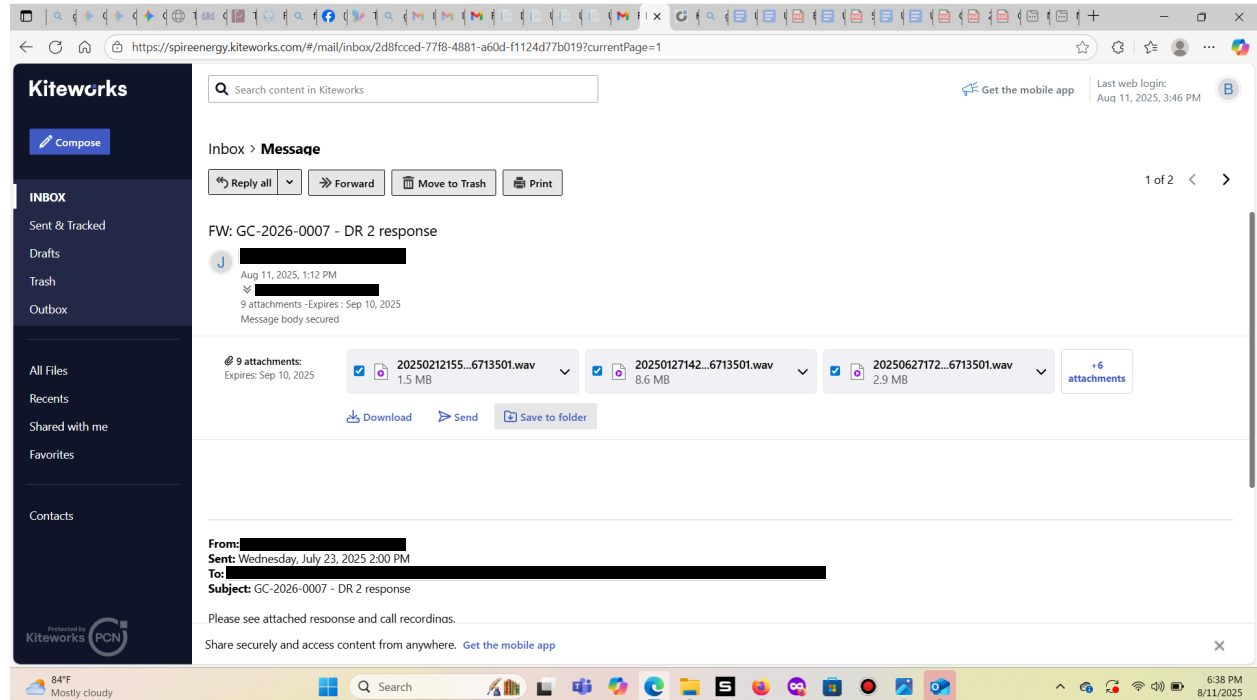

iling Regarding Procedural Misconduct in Case No. GC-2026-0007

**Dear Commissioners,**

This filing serves to provide further evidence of procedural misconduct by Spire in my case, **GC-2026-0007**.

The attached screenshot shows a message sent by Spire's attorney, [REDACTED], to the PSC on **Wednesday, July 23, 2025**, containing discovery files specifically for Case No. **GC-2026-0007**. I, the pro se complainant, did not receive access to these discovery files until **August 11, 2025**.

This delay demonstrates that Spire provided discovery to the Commission almost three weeks before providing it to me, a direct party to the case. This action constitutes a breach of procedural fairness and due process, providing the Commission with an unfair advantage and hindering my ability to respond in a timely manner.

This new evidence further supports my previous claims of a systemic failure in Spire's discovery process and its continued pattern of unethical conduct.
