On April 15, 2019, in accordance with Commission Rule 240-20.100(8), Liberty-Empire filed with the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") its 2018 RES Compliance Report and 2019 RES Compliance Plan in public, confidential, and highly confidential versions. The Retail Rate Impact information, however, was not included with the April 15 submission.

Pursuant to the Commission's Order Granting Request for Expedited Treatment and Motion for Extension of Time, the Retail Rate Impact portions of Liberty-Empire's 2018 RES Compliance Report and 2019 RES Compliance Plan were submitted on June 28, 2019. After this filing was made, Staff brought it to our attention that the 2018 calculation of actual calendar year retail rate impact was missing from Section (8)(A)1P of the Report, and an error was discovered in the labeling of the columns in Table 2 of Attachment 9 and 3 to the Report and Plan. As such, the Company is submitting the following amended documents:

Report – Section (8)(A)1P: Calculation of Actual Calendar Year Retail Rate Impact; and Plan – Section (8)(B)1F: RES Retail Rate Impact.
