ORDER GRANTING THE APPLICATION TO INTERVENE OF CHARTER COMMUNICATIONS, INC.

On September 3, 2010, Union Electric Company, d/b/a AmerenUE, filed a tariff designed to increase its annual revenues for electric service. The Commission suspended that tariff and established September 27 as the deadline for interested parties to apply to intervene.

Charter Communications, Inc., applied to intervene on September 15. Charter is a corporation engaged in the provision of communication services over cable and broadband facilities. Charter purchases large amounts of electricity from AmerenUE to power its network operations centers and cable television headends throughout AmerenUE's service area. More than ten days have passed since Charter applied to intervene and no party has objected to that application.

The Commission finds that the interest of Charter in this case is different from that of the general public, and may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case. Furthermore, the Commission finds that allowing Charter to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The Application to Intervene of Charter Communications, Inc. is granted.
- 2. This order shall become effective on September 28, 2010.
