Through its Missouri Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP) and Rural Transit Assistance Program (RTAP), MLTRC trains city and county road crews, rural transit providers, and local agencies on infrastructure, safety, and operational best practices. These programs are trusted, scalable, and deeply embedded in Missouri's public service landscape.

More recently, MLTRC launched the Missouri Community Resilience Workforce Development Program through Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation grant. This initiative focuses on building a skilled workforce to support energy efficiency, weatherization, emergency response, and entrepreneurship, which mirror the kinds of outcomes envisioned under the Community Benefits Program.

MLTRC has extensive experience collaborating with various stakeholders to increase program reach and impact. MLTRC stands ready to collaborate with other agencies, including the Missouri Department of Natural Resources and Community Action partners, to support weatherization efforts and deliver targeted training statewide. # Coordinating with Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP)

MLTRC in partnership with Environmental Energy Consultants, LLC will collaborate with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR), Community Action Agencies, and local WAP providers to:

- Expand access to weatherization services for low-income households impacted by LLPS-related development.
- Deliver workforce training aligned with WAP standards and DOE Zero Energy Ready Home guidelines.
- Support community leaders and local officials with education on scalable energy efficiency, building operations, and maintenance.
- Leverage available funding to scale impact (possibly beyond Missouri at a future time) and avoid duplication of services.

- Statewide reach through LTAP/RTAP networks and partnerships with local governments, utilities, and community colleges.
