15	the Office of Public Counsel about the issues
16	in the case.
17	But I just want to tell you what I see
18	right now. The Staff counsel's report says
19	that the violations that you had in your
20	complaint have been taken care of. And I
21	guess what I'm I want to take the
22	temperature of the room and see if you feel
23	the same. I'd like to know what it is you
24	would like from the case.
25	MR BARBER: Settled and there's



1	there's nothing I could actually say. I mean,
2	the thing was about, all of a sudden the
3	primacy fee showed up with no warning and had
4	never been on the bills before. That's where
5	it all started. I mean, they've already been
6	given 186 percent increase just this year.
7	THE COURT: Well, I understand what your
8	issues are. I want to know what it is you
9	hope to gain by taking the case to hearing.
10	What would you like out of that?
11	MR. BARBER: Well, I think they should
12	have been up front with everybody. I mean,
13	even the Missouri Public Commission had no
14	idea of it. The Department of Natural
15	Resources didn't know it. Nobody knew this
16	was coming. It just all of a sudden showed
17	up. When I contacted the Commission and I
18	called contacted DNR, they were totally
19	astounded as I was.
20	THE COURT: Okay. I'm hearing your
21	issues; I'm not hearing what it is you want,
22	what the end result you would like.
23	MR. BARBER: Well, I just want them to be
24	up front with everybody. Like this last
25	postcard they sent out about this audit. That



1 was a good thing. 2 THE COURT: Okay. All right. Are you 3 interested in having a hearing? 4 No, if we don't need to. MR. BARBER: 5 THE COURT: Okay. I think what I'm going 6 to --7 MR. BARBER: As long as everything has 8 been addressed. 9 THE COURT: Okay. And let me ask the 10 Staff counsel and counsel for Liberty, other. 11 are you interested in the hearing, or are you 12 happy with the issues being resolved? 13 MS. CARTER: I can speak. For Liberty, 14 we believe we have addressed all of Mr. 15 Barber's issues. I would say, though, on the primacy fee, Mr. Barber, I don't remember that 16 17 being part of this complaint, but that is a 18 pass-through to the government, and is not a 19 new charge. So if you have other questions on 20 that, we can follow up separately. 21 MR. BARBER: I had it explained to No. 2.2 me through the DNR. So, my thought was, was 23 it had never been on any of the bills in four 2.4 years that I had been here until this, this 25 past August.



1	THE COURT: How about the Office of
2	Public Counsel?
3	MS. MARTIN: The Office of the Public
4	Counsel is if Mr. Barber is comfortable
5	with how everything's gone on, we are okay
6	with not having a hearing. I don't know if it
7	would be appropriate, Judge, but, Mr. Barber,
8	if you could contact my email to kind of spell
9	out. I've just been a little confused. I
10	just want to make sure I just would like
11	clarity on the issues that you've been having
12	so that we can make sure that they are fully
13	taken care of.
14	MR. BARBER: Yeah. If you could send me
15	that email.
16	MS. MARTIN: Yeah.
17	THE COURT: Ms. Kerr?
18	MS. KERR: Well, it's like you said, the
19	issue was that Liberty addressed all the
20	issues for Mr. Barber. So all of those issues
21	actually have been resolved, and there doesn't
22	seem to be a reason or a need to have a
23	hearing.
24	THE COURT: Okay. I'm hearing consensus
25	from all parties on this case. So I'm going



1	to I'm still going to issue an order
2	because I think it's important for Mr. Barber
3	and for the public to have a discussion of
4	what happened in the complaint and the
5	resolution. But I'll issue that order
6	probably late next week. Really late next
7	week, because I'm in trial next week, and then
8	the week after arguing in the Western
9	District. So I'll be back to being a judge in
10	two weeks. So I will do that.
11	And I want to thank you-all for being
12	persistent through all these technical issues
13	and the issues that we've had with this
14	conference. Thanks, everybody, for coming
15	back and coming together and doing this, and
16	thanks, everyone, for working on this
17	complaint so we could work it out.
18	And, Mr. Barber, thank you for bringing
19	this to the Commission's attention. We really
20	appreciate your complaint and your
21	participation.
22	And with that, I'm going to tell you-all,
23	good afternoon and have a great day.
24	MR. BARBER: You as well. Y'all have a
25	great afternoon and a blessed weekend.
