Pursuant to Exhibit 206 of the March 20, 2019 Report and Order on Remand in Case No. EA-2016-0358, the June 5, 2019 Amended Report and Order in Case No. EM-2019-0150, and the October 12, 2023 Report and Order in Case No. EA-2023-0017, Grain Belt Express LLC ("Grain Belt Express") hereby submits an annual status update.

Economic Impact Data

Grain Belt Express continues to engage in contractor selection efforts for Engineering, Procurement & Construction ("EPC"), as well as other services and materials suppliers for the full-scale approximately three-year construction period. Once such contractors have been identified and full-scale construction begins, Grain Belt Express intends to instruct contractors on data reporting requirements to ensure regulatory compliance, including the economic impact reporting requirements of the Order in Case No. EA-2023-0017.

In late October and early November, 2025, Grain Belt Express undertook construction activities in Monroe County on the converter station parcel, owned in fee simple by Grain Belt Express. This construction activity falls outside of the approximately three-year construction period for which Grain Belt Express is required to report economic impact data.

Grain Belt Express will provide economic impact data once the approximately three-year construction period commences.

Protocol Complaints with Explanation of How Resolved/Addressed, Including Timeframe for Resolving/Addressing

 On October 15, 2024, Cheri Meadows, a landowner along the route of the Tiger Connector, filed a complaint with the Commission, noting her dissatisfaction with the route crossing her property. This complaint was docketed as MPSC Case No. EC-2025-0136. The Commission Staff filed two Reports in the complaint proceeding and both Staff Reports found that there had been no violation of any Commission, rule, statute or Order. On October 29, 2025, the Missouri Commission issued its Report and Order, dismissing Ms. Meadows' complaint and finding in favor of Grain Belt Express.

Nearby Utility Facilities

Exhibit 206 to the CCN Order in Case No. EA-2016-0358 requires Grain Belt Express to file "annual status updates" on discussions with Staff, a summary of the results of any additional studies, and any mitigation measures that have been implemented to address underground metallic structures, telecom facilities and AC lines. Mitigation measures indicated by future studies must be implemented within three (3) months of discovery that additional mitigation measures are needed, or as quickly as reasonably practical thereafter.

Grain Belt Express' selected contractors and Grain Belt Express have developed a detailed crossing matrix that tracks rights-of-way, utilities, roads and other infrastructure to be crossed by the route. The matrix is being updated throughout the design process to ensure that appropriate clearances and approvals are in place for the different types of crossings. Grain Belt Express has been coordinating with the owners of nearby infrastructure to understand and satisfy their physical, electrical, and operational requirements. Grain Belt Express has conducted a general pipeline interference screening study to assess impacts to nearby parallel and crossing utilities. Grain Belt Express is conducting further detailed interference studies with pipeline owners to determine whether mitigation measures are required to address any identified adverse impacts to their facilities. Grain Belt Express is committed to continued coordination with Staff and the owners of nearby facilities.
