STAFF RECOMMENDATION

COMES NOW Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, through the undersigned counsel, and for its Recommendation respectfully states as follows:

- 1. On March 19, 2021, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri ("Ameren Missouri") filed tariff sheets that will temporarily increase the qualifying federal poverty level associated with its Keeping Current Low Income Pilot Program (heating and cooling programs). The revised tariff sheets would increase the qualifying federal poverty level from 150 percent to 200 percent for the Keeping Current heating program, and from 150 percent to 250 percent for the Keeping Current cooling program. According to the terms of the filed tariff sheets, these increases in the qualifying federal poverty level will only be effective through December 31, 2021, after which time the qualifying federal poverty levels will revert to 150 percent. The tariff sheets were assigned Tariff No. YE-2021-0172.
- 2. Along with the tariff sheets, Ameren Missouri filed a motion for expedited treatment. The motion asks that the tariff sheets be approved to go into effect on April 1, 2021, so that Ameren Missouri can begin providing assistance to additional customers who have been harmed by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 3. Also on March 19, 2021, the Commission issued an *Order Directing*Response to Request for Expedited Approval of Tariff ("Order") in which the Commission

ordered, "Staff shall file a recommendation regarding Ameren Missouri's tariff (Tariff No. YE-2021-0172) and its request for expedited approval of that tariff by March 23, 2021, at 1:00 p.m."

- 4. Given the unique circumstances surrounding Ameren Missouri's filing, namely the COVID-19 pandemic, Staff does not object to the request for expedited treatment.
- 5. Staff has reviewed the tariff sheets and recommends that the Commission approve the following tariff sheets, filed on March 19, 2021, to go into effect on April 1, 2021, as requested by Ameren Missouri:

6. Staff has verified that Ameren Missouri is not delinquent on any assessment and has filed its Annual Report. Staff is not aware of any other matter before the Commission that affects or is affected by this filing.

WHEREFORE Staff recommends the Commission approve the tariff sheets listed above, to be effective for service rendered on and after April 1, 2021, and grant such other and further relief as the Commission finds appropriate in the circumstances.
