1. On November 11, 2025, Confluence Rivers filed an application requesting that the Commission approve its acquisition of the sewer system assets of the currently unregulated system of Swan Lake Estates, LLC and grant Confluence Rivers a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to operate the system and provide service to the public.

Dear Resident:

As a private-owned, regulated water and wastewater utility in the state of Missouri, Confluence Rivers Utility Operating Company works closely with the Missouri Public Utilities Commission (MoPSC) when applying for approval to acquire an existing system.

We are currently applying for Certificates of Convenience and Necessity associated with the potential purchase of two Swan Lake wastewater facilities: Swan Lake and Bates City Mobile Home Park. Confluence Rivers proposes to charge customers within Swan Lake a fixed monthly rate of \$19.02 for wastewater services. In addition, Confluence Rivers will continue the current rates in effect at closing for Bates City Mobile Home Park (\$6,500 per month to be billed to the mobile home park) and in addition, the Company will apply Confluence Rivers' existing service charges for these systems, subject to Commission approval. This pre-purchase (acquisition) process provides an opportunity for the public to track the progress of the case located in the Commission's electronic filing information system (EFIS), as well as to submit comments. Consists of the costs incurred by the Company for construction including parts, material, labor and equipment, but excluding the cost of the meter. See Rule 5 B.	
<u>Service Connection Inspection Fee</u>	\$82.50
<u>Water Service Line Inspection Fee</u>	\$25.00
<u>Turn-On/Turn-Off (Requested by the Customer)</u>	
8 am to 5 pm Monday through Friday (scheduled 24hrs in advance)	\$27.50
Before 8 am and after 5 pm, Saturdays/Sundays, or scheduled less than 24 hours in advance	\$164.00
<u>Turn-On/Turn-Off Associated With Non-Payment</u>	\$27.50 / Trip
<u>On-site Collection Charge</u>	\$27.50
This charge will be added to the current bill if the Company personnel is on-site to disconnect the service when the Customer pays the bill. The disconnection fee may not be assessed if the service is not physically disconnected.
