1 THE COURT: Good afternoon everyone. My  
2 computer's booting up here very slowly and I'm not  
3 online yet, so if you'll just be patient, hopefully it's  
4 only a few more minutes. I appreciate it. A little  
5 technical problem here that I'm working on solving.  
6 This is going to be recorded. This is a procedural  
7 conference in case number EO-2025-0228, styled in the  
8 matter of the application of White River Valley Electric  
9 Cooperative, Inc., for approval of designated service  
10 boundaries within portions of Christian County,  
11 Missouri.

12 My name is Karolin Walker, and I'm the  
13 judge assigned to preside over this case. We're going  
14 to discuss some procedural issues only during this call.  
15 First, let's do entry of appearance of counsel in the  
16 case. If you could state your name, who you represent,  
17 and where you work, I would be most appreciative. Let's  
18 start with White river.

19 MS. MCCORD: I'm Megan McCord, I  
20 represent White River Valley Electric Cooperative. My  
21 business address is P.O. Box 14287, Springfield,  
22 Missouri 65814. My firm name is Friel, McCord, &  
23 Smiley, LLC.

24 THE COURT: Staff counsel.

25 MS. KLAUS: Good afternoon. Alexandra

1 Klaus on behalf of Staff, Missouri Public Service  
2 Commission. Our address is P.O. Box 360, Jefferson  
3 City, Missouri 65102.

4 THE COURT: And Ms. Klaus, do you have a  
5 member of Staff on the call as well? You could --

6 MS. KLAUS: Yes. My apologies, Judge.  
7 Alan Bax is present on behalf of Staff as well.

8 THE COURT: Great. The office of Public  
9 Counsel.

10 MS. MARTIN: Representing the Office of  
11 the Public Counsel is Anna Martin. And I believe that -  
12 - I apologize, I'm not feeling particularly well. But I  
13 believe that our address is on file.

14 THE COURT: And Counsel for Liberty.

15 MS. KNOWLTON: Good afternoon, Judge.  
16 Sarah Knowlton and Diana Carter for the Empire District  
17 Electric Company, doing business as, Liberty.

18 THE COURT: Okay. Anyone else we haven't  
19 identified? Oh, I don't see anyone else. Okay. The  
20 purpose of the procedural conference is to resolve any  
21 issues that are possible and give the parties a chance  
22 to discuss any issues outside the hearing in an effort  
23 to resolve them. At the end of the call I'm going to  
24 sign off and let you talk to each other on this call  
25 without me. I scheduled the conference because the

1 Office of Public Counsel objected (indiscernible) filed  
2 in this case. Ms. Martin, I'd like you to discuss  
3 (indiscernible) reasons for disagreement with the  
4 stipulation.

5 MS. MARTIN: Sure. The only real reasons  
6 that the OPC disagreed with the stipulation and  
7 agreement is that the -- nothing in the case prior to  
8 that stipulation agreement discussed Liberty, and all  
9 the assessments and analysis was just regarding White  
10 River getting that -- getting that territory. So we  
11 wanted more information regarding what would happen with  
12 customers, customer notice, if they were moving to  
13 Liberty, things like that, particularly due to recent  
14 issues that Liberty has had with billing and customer  
15 service.

16 THE COURT: And are those issues, were  
17 they in the original petition for White River? Lexi,  
18 can you please let me know, if you recall.

19 MS. KLAUS: I can't speak from  
20 recollection as to whether customer transfers were  
21 discussed in the application. I think that there has  
22 been information provided that -- and please correct me  
23 if I'm wrong, Megan, Diana, Sarah -- that with the  
24 property description associated with the application  
25 there would be no customer transfers with that.

1 MS. MARTIN: It does, yeah. So sorry to  
2 add a little more information. I spoke to Megan after I  
3 filed our objection and I do know that the COO of White  
4 River, I feel -- and, Megan, correct me if I'm wrong,  
5 okay -- had an affidavit that no customers, current  
6 customers, were moving to Liberty. And we did get some  
7 information regarding the development -- the developers  
8 in the areas and things like that. We just wanted to  
9 make sure that all those developers and things could  
10 still have notice if they had any concerns.

11 That was actually the only thing that I  
12 still am wanting to talk to Liberty and -- or excuse me,  
13 Empire and White River about. Hopefully, with fewer  
14 words, because of my voice.

15 THE COURT: So on the issue of whether or  
16 not they're noticed developers in the area, do you have  
17 any information, Ms. Martin? You have not received  
18 information that you feel you need?

19 MS. MARTIN: I think there was a little  
20 bit of information that Megan gave me. I just wanted it  
21 all cleared up so that I knew who knew, who didn't know  
22 any -- because I think that there were some agreements  
23 perhaps with Empire, if that was -- I'm sorry, I'm a  
24 little brain fogged. But, Megan, if you could clarify.  
25 My brain isn't working.

1 MS. MCCORD: Sure. So Anna reached out,  
2 I think, last -- a couple of weeks ago. And the  
3 information we provided was that there have been several  
4 developers that have requested White River to serve  
5 them, that are now included as part of the stipulation  
6 agreement that White River will be serving them as part  
7 of it. So aside from that, I understand that Public  
8 Counsel has a public notice concern.

9 As I stated in my response to their  
10 objection, it's my understanding -- and I -- Diana, I  
11 don't know about you -- but it's my understanding and, I  
12 guess, thought that this case would probably follow the  
13 previous 386800 case, whereas, we wrap up this case with  
14 a stipulation and agreement. And then we are going to  
15 have to file subsequent territorial agreement cases to  
16 amend these territories. Now, if for no other reason  
17 than to make sure Liberty gets their tariff, right, I  
18 know.

19 So my thought was that these subsequent  
20 cases that we're going to have to file now after  
21 wrapping up this case, will provide that public notice  
22 as it did in that previous 386800 case. And so part of  
23 what we did file with our response to, was notifying  
24 everyone that no existing customers of White Rivers will  
25 be transferred as part of this agreement. And the Chief

1       Engineering officer at White River did include an  
2       affidavit saying as such.

3                   MS. CARTER: And I'm in complete  
4       agreement with that. I think as Megan and I put the  
5       stipulation together, it was our intent that approval of  
6       the stipulation in this docket would just affect that  
7       one property, the one parcel that is going to White  
8       River. And White River and Empire are on the hook for  
9       staying with their agreement, moving into the other  
10      dockets. But OPC, for example, would still be able to  
11      participate in those new proceedings. Notice would be  
12      the normal notice procedure under the rules.

13                  MS. MARTIN: Okay. So this is just -- I  
14      just -- to clarify this, because that's the other part.  
15      With the other properties that were included in the  
16      stipulation, that wouldn't be finalized until those  
17      other cases?

18                  MS. CARTER: I think White River and  
19      Empire are in agreement that we would need to file for  
20      approval with the Commission to amend those various  
21      territorial agreements.

22                  MS. MARTIN: Okay. Well --

23                  THE COURT: Ms. Martin, I'm sorry to  
24      interrupt you. But let me ask, given those facts, is it  
25      OPC's -- are they going to request a hearing in this

1 case?

2 MS. MARTIN: I don't believe so. I think  
3 --

4 THE COURT: So, do you think you guys  
5 might be able to talk and work this out?

6 MS. MARTIN: Yeah, I was -- that's what I  
7 was thinking even before today started. I figured that  
8 we just probably needed to have a chat so that I could  
9 see, I mean, where you guys are. And I'm so sorry, my  
10 voice is just dying more and more by the second.

11 THE COURT: Okay. So I think ordinarily  
12 I would ask everyone to give me their available hearing  
13 dates and send in procedural schedules, but it sounds  
14 like you're really close and maybe, my suggestion would  
15 be, amending the stipulation to address OPC's concerns.  
16 But I'm not going to be part of that discussion. So I  
17 think if we're all in agreement, what I'm going to do  
18 now is sign off and let you all talk to each other.  
19 Anyone have an objection to that?

20 MS. MCCORD: No.

21 THE COURT: Okay. And I also want to let  
22 you know that I haven't done it with -- there's a  
23 pending motion to file a response to OPC's objection to  
24 the stipulation that was filed out of time. There was  
25 no opposition to it. So I'm going to go ahead and grant

1 that motion probably next week. And (indiscernible) the  
2 motion carry and the response be filed.

3 MS. MCCORD: Thank you.

4 THE COURT: I'm going to sign off right  
5 now and let you all talk to each other. So thank you  
6 all for coming. This has been great. Have a good day.

7 MS. MCCORD: Thank you.

8 MS. KLAUS: Thank you.

9 MS. KNOWLTON: Thank you.

10 MS. CARTER: Thank you, Judge.

11 MS. MARTIN: Thank you.
