1. On June 23, 2026, Confluence Rivers and Cannon Home Association, Inc., (Cannon Home) filed an application with the Commission requesting a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) to acquire, own, install, construct, operate, control, manage and maintain a sewer system in Ralls County, Missouri. The requested CCN would allow Confluence Rivers to acquire the sewer system assets of Cannon Home.

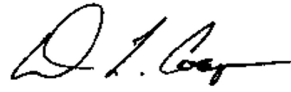
2. Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-60.050(2) requires that Confluence Rivers provide notice of the Application to all potential customers within the requested service area.

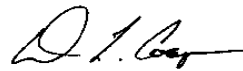

Dear Resident:

As a private-owned, regulated water and wastewater utility in the state of Missouri, Confluence Rivers Utility Operating Company works closely with the Missouri Public Service Commission (MoPSC) when applying for approval to acquire an existing system.

We are currently applying for Certificates of Convenience and Necessity associated with the potential purchase of Cannon Home Association, Inc. Our proposed monthly rate is \$33.56 per month for the first 1,000 gallons water use, plus \$6.99 per 1,000 gallons after the first 1,000 gallons, which is Cannon Home Association, Inc's currently approved existing rates. In addition, the Company will apply Confluence Rivers' existing service charges for these systems, subject to Commission approval. This pre-purchase (acquisition) process provides an opportunity for the public to track the progress of the case located in the Commission's electronic filing information system (EFIS), as well as to submit comments.
