GENERAL INFORMATION

Purpose

FERC Form No. 1 (FERC Form 1) is an annual regulatory requirement for Major electric utilities, licensees and others (18 C.F.R. § 141.1). FERC Form No. 3-Q (FERC Form 3-Q) is a quarterly regulatory requirement which supplements the annual financial reporting requirement (18 C.F.R. § 141.400). These reports are designed to collect financial and operational information from electric utilities, licensees and others subject to the jurisdiction of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission. These reports are also considered to be non-confidential public use forms.

Who Must Submit

Each Major electric utility, licensee, or other, as classified in the Commission's Uniform System of Accounts Prescribed for Public Utilities, Licensees, and Others Subject To the Provisions of The Federal Power Act (18 C.F.R. Part 101), must submit FERC Form 1 (18 C.F.R. § 141.1), and FERC Form 3-Q (18 C.F.R. § 141.400).

Note: Major means having, in each of the three previous calendar years, sales or transmission service that exceeds one of the following:

- one million megawatt hours of total annual sales,
- 100 megawatt hours of annual sales for resale,
- 500 megawatt hours of annual power exchanges delivered, or
- 500 megawatt hours of annual wheeling for others (deliveries plus losses).

What and Where to Submit

Submit FERC Form Nos. 1 and 3-Q electronically through the eCollection portal at <https://eCollection.ferc.gov>, and according to the specifications in the Form 1 and 3-Q taxonomies.

The Corporate Officer Certification must be submitted electronically as part of the FERC Forms 1 and 3-Q filings.

Submit immediately upon publication, by either eFiling or mail, two (2) copies to the Secretary of the Commission, the latest Annual Report to Stockholders. Unless eFiling the Annual Report to Stockholders, mail the stockholders report to the Secretary of the Commission at:

For the CPA Certification Statement, submit within 30 days after filing the FERC Form 1, a letter or report (not applicable to filers classified as Class C or Class D prior to January 1, 1984). The CPA Certification Statement can be either eFiled or mailed to the Secretary of the Commission at the address above.

The CPA Certification Statement should:

Attest to the conformity, in all material aspects, of the below listed (schedules and pages) with the Commission's applicable Uniform System of Accounts (including applicable notes relating thereto and the Chief Accountant's published accounting releases), and

Be signed by independent certified public accountants or an independent licensed public accountant certified or licensed by a regulatory authority of a State or other political subdivision of the U. S. (See 18 C.F.R. §§ 41.10-41.12 for specific qualifications.)

For any page(s) that is not applicable to the respondent, omit the page(s) and enter "NA," "NONE," or "Not Applicable" in column (d) on the List of Schedules, pages 2 and 3.

Enter the month, day, and year for all dates. Use customary abbreviations. The "Date of Report" included in the header of each page is to be completed only for resubmissions (see VII. below).

Generally, except for certain schedules, all numbers, whether they are expected to be debits or credits, must be reported as positive. Numbers having a sign that is different from the expected sign must be reported by enclosing the numbers in parentheses.

For all transactions identified as LFP, provide in a footnote the termination date of the contract defined as the earliest date either buyer or seller can unilaterally cancel the contract.

OLF - Other Long-Term Firm Transmission Service. Report service provided under contracts which do not conform to the terms of the Open Access Transmission Tariff. "Long-Term" means one year or longer and "firm" means that service cannot be interrupted for economic reasons and is intended to remain reliable even under adverse conditions. OS - Other Transmission Service. Use this classification only for those services which can not be placed in the above-mentioned classifications, such as all other service regardless of the length of the contract and service FERC Form. Describe the type of service in a footnote for each entry.

AD - Out-of-Period Adjustments. Use this code for any accounting adjustments or "true-ups" for service provided in prior reporting periods. Provide an explanation in a footnote for each adjustment.

EXCERPTS FROM THE LAW

Federal Power Act, 16 U.S.C. § 791a-825r

Sec. 3. The words defined in this section shall have the following meanings for purposes of this Act, to with:

'Corporation' means any corporation, joint-stock company, partnership, association, business trust, organized group of persons, whether incorporated or not, or a receiver or receivers, trustee or trustees of any of the foregoing. It shall not include 'municipalities, as hereinafter defined;

'Person' means an individual or a corporation;

'Licensee, means any person, State, or municipality Licensed under the provisions of section 4 of this Act, and any assignee or successor in interest thereof;

'municipality means a city, county, irrigation district, drainage district, or other political subdivision or agency of a State competent under the Laws thereof to carry and the business of developing, transmitting, unitizing, or distributing power;

"project' means. a complete unit of improvement or development, consisting of a power house, all water conduits, all dams and appurtenant works and structures (including navigation structures) which are a part of said unit, and all storage, diverting, or fore bay reservoirs directly connected therewith, the primary line or lines transmitting power there from to the point of junction with the distribution system or with the interconnected primary transmission system, all miscellaneous structures used and useful in connection with said unit or any part thereof, and all water rights, rights-of-way, ditches, dams, reservoirs, Lands, or interest in Lands the use and occupancy of which are necessary or appropriate in the maintenance and operation of such unit;

"Sec. 4. The Commission is hereby authorized and empowered

'To make investigations and to collect and record data concerning the utilization of the water 'resources of any region to be developed, the water-power industry and its relation to other industries and to interstate or foreign commerce, and concerning the location, capacity, development costs, and relation to markets of power sites; ... to the extent the Commission may deem necessary or useful for the purposes of this Act."

"Sec. 304.

Every Licensee and every public utility shall file with the Commission such annual and other periodic or special* reports as the Commission may by rules and regulations or other prescribe as necessary or appropriate to assist the Commission in the proper administration of this Act. The Commission may prescribe the manner and FERC Form in which such reports shall be made, and require from such persons specific answers to all questions upon which the Commission may need information. The Commission may require that such reports shall include, among other things, full information as to assets and Liabilities, capitalization, net investment, and reduction thereof, gross receipts, interest due and paid, depreciation, and other reserves, cost of project and other facilities, cost of maintenance and operation of the project and other facilities, cost of renewals and replacement of the project works and other facilities, depreciation, generation, transmission, distribution, delivery, use, and sale of electric energy. The Commission may require any such person to make adequate provision for currently determining such costs and other facts. Such reports shall be made under oath unless the Commission otherwise specifies*.10

The accompanying financial statements were prepared in accordance with the accounting requirements of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") as set forth in its applicable Uniform System of Accounts and published accounting releases, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting that varies from generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America ("GAAP"). These requirements differ from GAAP related to (1) the presentation of deferred income taxes, (2) the presentation of regulatory debits and credits, (3) the presentation of regulatory assets and liabilities, (4) treatment of equity carrying charges, and (5) the presentation of accruals associated with the cost of removal included within the accumulated depreciation reserve. Accordingly, certain footnotes are not prepared on the same basis as the financial statements presented herein.

NEXTERA ENERGY TRANSMISSION SOUTHWEST, INC.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2025 (in thousands, unless otherwise noted)

NOTE 1. ORGANIZATION AND BUSINESS

NextEra Energy Transmission Southwest, LLC (NEET Southwest) is a subsidiary of NextEra Energy Transmission, LLC (NEET), a leading competitive transmission company in North America, is focused on developing transmission assets in the Southwest Power Pool (SPP) region.

On April 26, 2022, NEET Southwest was awarded the Minco-Pleasant Valley-Draper (Minco) project by the SPP to construct a new approximately 48 miles of 345 kV transmission facilities in Oklahoma, interconnecting the Minco substation in Grady County and the Pleasant Valley and Draper substations in Cleveland County. Minco commenced commercial operations on January 30, 2025.

On October 27, 2021, NEET Southwest was awarded the Wolf Creek-Blackberry transmission project by SPP. The project is approximately 94 miles of 345 kV transmission line that will run from the Wolf Creek substation in Coffey County, Kansas to the Blackberry substation in Jasper County, Missouri. Wolf Creek-Blackberry commenced commercial operations on July 15, 2025.

In August 2023, NEET Southwest was awarded the Crossroads – Hobbs – Roadrunner project by the SPP to construct a new approximately 135 miles of 345 kV transmission line in New Mexico. The project will interconnect the existing Crossroads, Hobbs and Roadrunner substations in Roosevelt and Lea counties and is expected to go into service in 2026.

NOTE 2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Regulatory Accounting -The Company is subject to rate regulation by the FERC. The Company's rates are designed to recover the cost of providing electric service to its customers and currently include a return on invested capital. Revenues from the Company's cost based formula rates are recorded when earned. The Company achieves matching of costs and related revenues by deferring the net under recovery or over recovery. Any under recovered costs or over recovered revenues are collected from or returned to customers in subsequent periods.

As a regulated utility, the Company records assets and liabilities that result from the regulated ratemaking process that would otherwise not be recorded under GAAP for non-regulated companies. Regulatory assets represent costs that will be included as a component of future tariff rates and regulatory liabilities represent amounts that have been collected in current rates to recover costs that are expected to be incurred, or refunded to customers, in future periods.

When regulatory assets are probable of recovery through regulated rates, the Company records them as assets on the balance sheet. Once a regulatory asset is recorded, the Company reviews the probability of recovery at each balance sheet date, considering the impact of any changes or events during the period. If the likelihood of future recovery of any regulatory asset becomes less than probable, the Company will write off that regulatory asset as a charge against income.

If the Company were no longer subject to cost-based rate regulation, the existing regulatory assets would be written off. In addition, the regulator has the authority to disallow recovery of costs that it considers excessive or imprudently incurred. The continued applicability of regulatory accounting is assessed at each reporting date.

See Note 3 - Regulatory Matters for additional information.

Cash and Cash Equivalents - All highly liquid investments with a maturity at the date of purchase of three months or less are considered cash. Cash for short-term working capital needs is held in financial institutions.

Accounts Receivable - Receivables are associated with revenues earned from contracts with customers consisting of both billed and unbilled amounts. Receivables represent unconditional rights to consideration and reflect the differences in timing of revenue recognition and cash collections.

Receivables represent unconditional rights to consideration and reflect the differences in timing of revenue recognition and cash collections. If any of the customer receivable balances should be deemed uncollectible, it could have a material adverse effect on the Company's results of operations and financial condition. However, management does not believe significant credit risk existed at December 31, 2025. Accounts receivable balances would be adjusted for any write-offs and any estimated allowance for doubtful accounts, which is calculated on the basis of the expected credit losses. The allowance for doubtful accounts is reviewed periodically, considering historical and current information such as average write-offs to estimate the expected credit losses. There was no allowance for doubtful accounts recorded as of December 31, 2025, respectively.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Property, Plant and Equipment, Net - Property, plant and equipment, net consists primarily of transmission assets. Property, plant and equipment are recorded at cost and depreciated on a straight-line average remaining life basis. Accumulated depreciation consists of the cost of units of property retired less estimated net salvage value. Maintenance and repairs of property as well as replacements and renewals of items determined to be less than units of property are charged to operations and maintenance expenses.

Construction work in progress includes construction materials, progress payments on major equipment contracts, third-party engineering costs and other costs directly associated with the construction of various projects. Upon completion of the projects, these costs are transferred to property, plant and equipment in service.

Depreciation of the Company's transmission assets is provided on a straight-line basis, primarily over its average remaining useful life as approved by the FERC.

See Note 4 - Property, plant and equipment, net for additional information.

AFUDC - Allowance for funds used during construction ("AFUDC") represents the estimated costs of borrowed and equity funds used to finance regulated plant additions before they go into service and is capitalized as part of the cost of construction. AFUDC is recoverable through rates over the life of the related asset once that asset is placed in service. AFUDC related to the cost of borrowed funds is recorded as a reduction to interest expense. AFUDC related to the cost of equity funds is recorded as a component of other income.

As a component of construction work in progress, AFUDC will be placed into service along with other construction costs attributable to assets placed in service and depreciated over the useful lives of those assets in accordance with rates approved by FERC.

Impairment of Long-Lived Assets - Long-lived assets that are held and used are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate carrying values may not be recoverable. As of December 31, 2025, the Company concluded no impairment adjustments were necessary.

Revenue Recognition - Operating revenues are derived primarily from transmission services. Revenues are determined using approved tariff rates and are recognized as transmission service is provided. The tariff rates permit the Company to recover allowable costs and earn a return on investments in property, plant and equipment. The obligation to provide transmission services is satisfied over time as the customer simultaneously receives and consumes benefits.

Income Taxes - Deferred income taxes are provided on all significant temporary differences between the financial statement and tax basis of assets or liabilities. The significant temporary differences result primarily from property basis differences caused by differences in book and tax depreciation.

Included in regulatory assets on the Company's balance sheets is the revenue equivalent of the difference in accumulated deferred income taxes computed under accounting rules, as compared to regulatory accounting rules. The resulting excess deferred taxes will be returned to rate payers in the future. The Company is a member of a consolidated group, NextEra Energy and subsidiaries, which files a consolidated tax return. The income tax accounts in the accompanying financial statements are determined as if the Company filed a separate tax return.

For FERC regulatory reporting purposes, the income tax provision reflects the use of the "separate return method" except that tax benefits that could not be used on a separate return basis, but are used on the consolidated tax return, are recorded by the subsidiary that generated the tax benefits.

NOTE 3. REGULATORY MATTERS

Formula Rate Filings

Challenge to New Mexico Renewable Transmission Authority

In November 2023, Southwestern Public Service Company (“SPS”) submitted a challenge to the New Mexico Renewable Energy Transmission Authority’s (“NM RETA”) decision to work with NEET Southwest on the Crossroads-Hobbs-Roadrunner project. On March 27, 2024, NM RETA issued a final decision rejecting SPS’s challenge.

On April 25, 2024, SPS appealed NM RETA’s decision to the New Mexico District Court for the First District. Oral argument was held on January 31, 2025, and the District Court issued a decision on April 10, 2025, affirming NM RETA’s decision and rejecting SPS’s challenges. SPS has 30 days from the date of the District Court order to further appeal to the New Mexico Court of Appeals. On May 12, 2025, SPS filed a request to the New Mexico Court of Appeals for an extension of its May 12 deadline to file an appeal, which the Court of Appeals granted. SPS filed its writ petition on May 29, 2025, and NEET Southwest and NM RETA responded in opposition on June 13, 2025. On June 30, 2025, the New Mexico Court of Appeals granted SPS’s writ petition. SPS requested a 6-month extension of time to submit its brief, in order to allow for settlement discussions with RETA, which the New Mexico Court of Appeals granted on October. 21, 2025. The court’s order requires one of the following by April 20, 2026: (1) a request for further extension of briefing deadlines; (2) a stipulated motion to dismiss if the parties agree to a settlement; and (3) SPS’s brief, if no settlement is reached.

The Company's revenues are received in accordance with the Southwest Power Pool Inc (SPP) Tariff which includes the Company's formula rate as approved by the FERC. The Company is required to file its annual true-up of the prior calendar year by May 15th and the projected net revenue requirement for the current calendar year by September 15th.

NOTE 6. LONG-TERM BORROWING

The Company has a long term loan with NEECH which allows the Company to continue to borrow to keep its capital structure of 60% equity and 40% debt balanced as its capital requirements arise. The long-term loan was renewed most recently in December 2025 and is due in November 2030. Draws for the years ended December 31, 2025 of \$65,378 are reflected as non-cash equity distributions on the Statement of Cash Flows.
