The current renewed facility operating license for the Wolf Creek Generating Station expires at midnight on March 11, 2045.

Evergy Missouri Metro, through its ownership in the facility, has provided the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) with a notification of intent to submit a Subsequent License Renewal Application (SLRA) in the first quarter of 2030, which would seek authorization for an additional 20 years of operation (through 2065).

Beyond this notification of intent, Evergy has not yet submitted a formal license renewal application or taken other formal regulatory actions with the NRC to extend the operating license.
