**ORDER ESTABLISHING TIME TO RESPOND  
TO MEEIA LOW INCOME EXEMPTION AND LED STREET LIGHTING  
STIPULATION AND AGREEMENT**

Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri, the Staff of the Commission, and the Office of the Public Counsel filed a Non-Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement Regarding MEEIA Low Income Exemption and LED Street Lighting Issues on March 12, 2015. The stipulation and agreement asks the Commission to issue an order approving the stipulation and agreement no later than March 20. Expedited approval is needed to allow Ameren Missouri to file a tariff to implement the agreement on or about March 27, so that the Low Income Exemption can take effect beginning with the June 2015 billing month.

The Commission's last agenda before March 20 will take place on March 19. Therefore, the Commission will direct that any party wishing to object to the stipulation and agreement do so on or before March 18.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. Any objection to the Non-Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement Regarding MEEIA Low Income Exemption and LED Street Lighting Issues, filed on March 12, 2015, shall be filed no later than March 18, 2015.

2. This order shall be effective when issued.
