ORDER APPROVING FUEL ADJUSTMENT TRUE-UP AND APPROVING TARIFF TO CHANGE FUEL ADJUSTMENT RATES

Issue Date: September 10, 2026

Effective Date: October 1, 2026

On July 30, 2026, in Case No. ER-2027-0027, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri submitted direct testimony and a proposed tariff sheet to implement changes to its Fuel Adjustment Rate (FAR) for the accumulation period ending May 31, 2026, revising its FAR for Accumulation Period 52 (AP52). On the same date, in Case No. EO-2027-0028, Ameren Missouri also submitted an application containing its 49th true-up filing for its Fuel Adjustment Clause (FAC) to implement a true-up adjustment for Recovery Period 49 (RP49), contemporaneous with the AP52 filing. Ameren Missouri requested that the Commission authorize a true-up adjustment and implement it under its FAC tariff. The proposed tariff sheet bears an effective date of October 1, 2026.

FAC True-Up

The true-up amount identified in Case No. EO-2027-0028 is the result of an over-collection of \$6,721,848, without interest, from customers during RP49 from October

2025 through May 2026. That true-up amount is included in the Fuel and Purchased Power Adjustment (FPA) amount in Ameren Missouri's AP52 adjustment filing in Case No. ER-2027-0027.

Staff filed its recommendation regarding Ameren Missouri's true-up on August 28, 2026, in which it examined the direct testimony of Raysene Logan, her supporting work papers, and the monthly information Ameren Missouri provided with its application. Staff recommended the Commission approve Ameren Missouri's RP49 true-up filing for inclusion in the changes in Ameren Missouri's AP52 adjustment filing in Case No. ER-2027-0027. No party objected to Staff's recommendations.

Based on the Commission's review of the verified filings, the Commission finds that the unopposed true-up amount is correct. The Commission will authorize Ameren Missouri to include the calculated amount in its next FAC accumulation period as previously described.

FAC tariff

With regard to Ameren Missouri's request to approve its FAC tariff, the dollar amount used to calculate the proposed rate schedules for AP52 is \$100,999, which includes \$3,060,961 as the fuel and purchased power amount recoverable from customers, and interest of \$3,761,886,¹ less the over-collection true-up amount for RP49 of \$6,721,848. Based on an average usage of 1,000 kWh per month, Ameren Missouri's requested adjustment would result in a decrease in the bill of a typical residential customer of approximately \$4.49.

¹ The interest amount of \$3,761,886 consists of \$126,165 for AP52 plus \$3,635,721 for RP49.

The Commission's Staff filed a recommendation regarding Ameren Missouri's tariff on August 28. Staff verified that Ameren Missouri's actual fuel and purchased power costs match the fuel and purchased power costs included in the company's calculated rates set out in the submitted tariff. Staff also reviewed Ameren Missouri's monthly interest rates that are applied to the monthly cumulative over- and under-recovery amounts for AP52, and RP49, and the calculation of the monthly amounts. Staff recommended that the Commission approve the FAR tariff to become effective on October 1, 2026. No party objected to Staff's recommendations.

Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-20.090(8) requires the Commission to issue an order approving or rejecting the company's tariff within 60 days of its filing. If the FAC rate adjustment complies with the Commission's rule, Section 386.266, RSMo, and the FAC mechanism established in the most recent general rate proceeding, the Commission is required to approve the rate adjustment or allow the proposed tariff implementing the adjustment go into effect by operation of law.²

The Commission has reviewed Ameren Missouri's testimony, Ameren Missouri's tariff filing, and Staff's verified recommendations and memorandums, and finds that the tariff sheet implementing the FAC rate adjustment is in compliance with the Commission's order establishing the FAC and with all applicable statutes and regulations. Therefore, the Commission will approve Ameren Missouri's proposed tariff.

Without Commission action, the tariff would become effective by operation of law on

October 1, 2026. Additionally, as noted above, the Commission's rule requires an order be issued within 60 days of the tariff filing. Therefore, the Commission finds it reasonable to make this order effective in less than 30 days.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The true-up amount for Recovery Period 49 is established for Ameren Missouri as an over-collection of \$6,721,848 from its customers and shall be reflected in the rate adjustment in Commission Case No. ER-2027-0027.
2. Ameren Missouri's tariff filing in Case No. ER-2027-0027, assigned Tracking No. JE-2027-0013, is approved to be effective October 1, 2026, as an interim rate adjustment, subject to true-up and prudence reviews. The tariff approved is:

3. This order shall become effective on October 1, 2026.
4. These cases shall close on October 2, 2026.
