APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

COMES NOW Brad Dean Taylor and Heather Michelle Taylor ("Intervenors"), and pursuant to Missouri Public Service Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.075, respectfully submit this Application to Intervene in the above-captioned proceeding. In support thereof, Intervenors state as follows:

IDENTIFICATION OF THE PROCEEDING

1. Evergy Metro, Inc., d/b/a Evergy Missouri Metro, and Evergy Missouri West, Inc., d/b/a Evergy Missouri West (collectively, "Evergy" or "Applicants"), have filed an application with the Missouri Public Service Commission seeking Certificates of Convenience and Necessity ("CCNs"), including authorization relating to the proposed Buchanan Bluffs Energy Center Unit 2 in Buchanan County, Missouri.
2. Buchanan Bluffs Energy Center Unit 2 is proposed as an approximately 710-megawatt combined-cycle natural-gas electric generating facility in Buchanan County, Missouri.

INTERVENORS' INTEREST AND BASIS FOR INTERVENTION

3. Intervenors Brad Dean Taylor and Heather Michelle Taylor reside at 11110 State Route E SE, Agency, Missouri 64401. Their telephone number is 816-387-6949 and their email address is Heathertaylor37@yahoo.com.
4. Intervenors' home and property are located approximately 0.25 miles, or approximately one-quarter mile, from the proposed Buchanan Bluffs Energy Center Unit 2 site.
5. Because of this immediate proximity, Intervenors have a direct and substantial interest in the Commission's determination concerning the proposed facility that is different from the interests of members of the general public who do not own property or reside in the immediate vicinity of the proposed site.
6. Intervenors are concerned that construction and operation of an approximately 710-megawatt natural-gas generating facility approximately one-quarter mile from their home and property could directly affect their use and enjoyment of their property and their quality of life.
7. Intervenors' particular concerns include potential impacts associated with construction and operational noise, increased traffic, air quality and emissions, nighttime lighting, safety, environmental impacts, property values, and the overall character and quality of life of the surrounding rural residential community.

WATER SUPPLY AND WATER RESOURCES

8. Intervenors are particularly concerned about the proposed facility's water requirements and the availability and long-term protection of water resources serving residents in the immediate area.

9. Given Intervenor's close proximity to the proposed facility, they have a direct interest in ensuring that the Commission fully evaluates the amount of water required for construction and operation of the proposed facility, the source and reliability of that water supply, the infrastructure necessary to provide it, and whether the project's water demands could adversely affect existing residents or local water resources.
10. Intervenor respectfully request that the Commission fully evaluate water-supply adequacy and reliability before determining whether a CCN should be granted for the proposed facility at this location.

RESIDENTIAL PROXIMITY AND QUALITY OF LIFE

11. Intervenor's residence is approximately 0.25 miles from the proposed facility. Accordingly, concerns regarding noise, lighting, traffic, emissions, construction activity, visual impacts, safety, and other operational impacts are not merely generalized concerns. They involve potential impacts occurring in the immediate vicinity of Intervenor's home and property.
12. Intervenor are concerned about the potential for continuous or recurring operational noise associated with a large generating facility, as well as construction noise and activity during development of the project.
13. Intervenor are also concerned about increased construction and operational traffic on roads serving the surrounding community and the potential effects of that traffic on residents living near the proposed facility.
14. Intervenor have a direct interest in the Commission's consideration of potential air-quality and environmental impacts associated with the proposed facility and the adequacy of measures proposed to mitigate impacts upon nearby residents.
15. Intervenor are further concerned about potential effects upon the value, use, enjoyment, and rural residential character of their property resulting from the construction and operation of a large industrial generating facility approximately one-quarter mile away.

HEALTH AND AIR-QUALITY CONCERNS

16. Intervenor are concerned about potential health and air-quality impacts associated with living approximately 0.25 miles, or one-quarter mile, from the proposed approximately 710-megawatt natural-gas generating facility.
17. The United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") regulates stationary combustion turbines under the Clean Air Act. EPA has identified stationary combustion turbines as major sources of hazardous air pollutants, including formaldehyde, toluene, benzene, and acetaldehyde.
18. EPA recognizes health concerns associated with exposure to particulate matter and ground-level ozone. EPA states that particulate pollution can affect the lungs and cardiovascular system and has been associated with aggravated asthma, decreased lung function, respiratory symptoms, irregular heartbeat, nonfatal heart attacks, and premature death in people with heart or lung disease. EPA further recognizes that ground-level ozone can inflame and damage airways, cause coughing and shortness of breath, and aggravate respiratory diseases such as asthma.
19. EPA identifies certain populations as being at increased risk from some forms of air pollution, including children, older adults, individuals with asthma, and individuals who are active outdoors.
20. Intervenor do not contend in this Application that any particular adverse health effect will necessarily occur at their residence as a result of the proposed facility. Rather, because their home and property are located approximately 0.25 miles from the proposed facility, Intervenor have a direct and particularized interest in ensuring that the Commission considers anticipated emissions and air-quality impacts, applicable

pollution-control technologies, monitoring requirements, and measures intended to protect residents living in close proximity to the proposed facility.

21. Intervenor respectfully request that the Commission consider whether the proposed pollution-control, monitoring, and mitigation measures are adequate to protect nearby residents and whether additional safeguards or conditions would be appropriate if a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity is granted for Buchanan Bluffs Energy Center Unit 2.

SITE SUITABILITY

22. Given the proximity of Intervenor's home and other residences to the proposed facility, Intervenor has a direct interest in whether the proposed site is appropriate for a generating facility of this size and nature.

23. Intervenor respectfully request that the Commission fully consider the suitability of the proposed location, including residential proximity, availability and reliability of water resources and necessary infrastructure, traffic and road impacts, environmental and air-quality considerations, and reasonable alternatives evaluated during the site-selection process.

24. Intervenor further request that the Commission consider whether adequate measures have been proposed to protect nearby landowners from potential construction and operational impacts if the proposed facility is approved.

INTERVENORS' INTEREST IS DIFFERENT FROM THAT OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC

25. Missouri Public Service Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.075 provides that the Commission may grant intervention when a proposed intervenor has an interest different from that of the general public that may be adversely affected by a final order arising from the case, or when granting intervention would serve the public interest.

26. Intervenor satisfy this standard because their residence and property are located approximately 0.25 miles from the proposed facility. Their interests as immediately neighboring residents and property holders are therefore particularized and materially different from those of members of the general public who do not live or own property near the proposed facility.

27. The Commission's ultimate determination regarding whether to authorize construction and operation of the proposed facility at this location may directly affect Intervenor's property, their use and enjoyment of their home, and the conditions of the immediate area in which they reside.

POSITION OF INTERVENORS

28. Intervenor oppose the relief sought by Applicants insofar as it would authorize construction and operation of Buchanan Bluffs Energy Center Unit 2 at the proposed location.

29. Intervenor seek the opportunity to participate fully in this proceeding, receive notice of filings and proceedings, review information relevant to the proposed project, present evidence or information as permitted by the Commission, respond to matters affecting their interests, and otherwise exercise the rights afforded to parties in this proceeding.

INTERVENTION WILL NOT UNDULY DELAY OR PREJUDICE THE PROCEEDING

30. Intervenor's participation will not unduly broaden the issues, cause unnecessary delay, or prejudice any party. The matters identified by Intervenor - including residential proximity, water resources, noise, traffic, air quality, potential health and environmental impacts, site suitability, property impacts, and appropriate

mitigation - relate directly to their particularized interests in the proposed facility.

31. This Application to Intervene is timely filed within the intervention deadline established by the Commission for Case No. EA-2026-0343.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Brad Dean Taylor and Heather Michelle Taylor respectfully request that the Missouri Public Service Commission:

A. Grant this Application to Intervene and permit Brad Dean Taylor and Heather Michelle Taylor to participate as parties in Case No. EA-2026-0343;

B. Consider Intervenors' particularized interests as residents and property holders located approximately 0.25 miles from the proposed Buchanan Bluffs Energy Center Unit 2 facility;

C. Fully consider issues concerning residential proximity, water-supply adequacy and reliability, noise, traffic, air quality and emissions, potential health and environmental impacts, safety, property impacts, site suitability, and the use and enjoyment of nearby residential property when determining whether to grant the requested CCN;

D. Deny the requested CCN for Buchanan Bluffs Energy Center Unit 2 at the proposed location or, alternatively, if the Commission approves the facility, impose such reasonable conditions, safeguards, monitoring requirements, and protections as the Commission determines appropriate to address impacts upon Intervenors and other nearby residents; and

E. Grant such other and further relief as the Commission deems just and reasonable.
