ORDER APPROVING STIPULATION AND AGREEMENT

Issue Date: September 24, 2026

Effective Date: October 24, 2026

On July 28, 2026, the Staff of the Commission filed the above-referenced complaint as a follow-up to its investigation in Case No. GS-2025-0295. That case involved a reportable natural gas incident which occurred on April 22, 2025, in Kansas City, Missouri.

In this complaint case, Staff contends that Spire Missouri Inc. violated certain sections of the Commission's safety standards found in Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-40.030. Staff also alleged that Spire failed to follow its written procedures for conducting operating and maintenance activities and for emergency response. Staff further alleged Spire failed to implement required actions to prevent an accidental ignition.

On August 27, 2026, Spire and Staff (collectively, “Signatories”) filed a Full and Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement (Stipulation).¹ The Signatories agree that they entered into the Stipulation to address the recommendations contained within the complaint. Staff made those recommendations to alleviate the risk of a future similar occurrence. The Signatories agree that Spire shall implement several procedures to avoid similar situations from what occurred on April 22, 2025. The Signatories also agree that Spire shall pay \$50,000 to the Public School Fund of the State of Missouri.

Commission Rule 20 CSR 240-4240.115(2) allows parties seven days to object to non-unanimous stipulations and agreements. More than seven days have elapsed since Spire and Staff filed the Stipulation, and no party has objected. Thus, the Commission may treat the Stipulation as unanimous.

The Commission finds the Stipulation reasonable, and will approve it.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Stipulation is approved, and the Signatories are ordered to comply with its terms.
2. Spire shall provide written notice in this docket when it renders the payment to the Public School Fund.
3. This order shall be effective on October 24, 2026.

¹ Despite its name, the Office of the Public Counsel (OPC) did not sign the Stipulation.

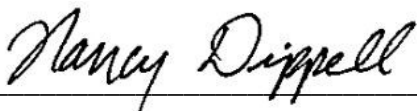
