On behalf of New-Mac Electric Cooperative, Inc., regarding the proposed amendment to 4 CSR 240-3.190, I would like to express our adamant opposition to the adoption of this rule. The investigation process would be both redundant and excessive resulting in poor service and increased costs to our own members.

In addition, the financial costs estimated in this proposal are inaccurate, specifically in the area of hours required to complete additional paperwork. Also, lost revenue from extended power outages, while waiting on investigations to be completed, could easily exceed the proposed costs. Who would bear the burden of these additional costs? Our members.

As for any beneficial effect, in the area of safety, for Cooperatives or their members, there are presently various regulations and numerous organizations performing the functions of monitoring and reporting accidents. Two primary examples are the Rural Utility Services' Safety Accreditation Program and the Missouri Electric Cooperative Insurance Plan's safety audits, both of which are successfully in place and funded.

Another concern for cooperatives is the fact that information from these reports could prove to be detrimental in litigation in an effort to enhance claims. This would only serve to increase insurance premiums.

In conclusion, passage of this amendment would create an unnecessary burden on cooperatives and their members while providing very little benefit to either.
