 calls that were terminated to Mid-Missouri were recorded at the originating
 end office and not the tandem. This problem was corrected 9-11-00.
 - OCA calls originated in Marshall were not recorded correctly. This problem was corrected 8-11-00.
 - OCA calls originating in Kirskville, Armstrong, Boonville, Dowing, Edina,
 Fayette, Glasgow, Higbee, Lancaster and New Franklin were recorded twice,
 once as a 006 record and once as an 001 record. Recording of the 001 record
