

Q: IN SWBT'S RESEARCH REGARDING THE ERICSSON SWITCH RECORDING PROBLEM, DID SWBT FIND PROBLEMS WITH THE RECORDING OF OTHER TYPES OF CALLS BESIDES LOCAL PLUS CALLS? IF SO, PLEASE DESCRIBE THE PROBLEMS FOUND, THE TYPES OF CALLS INVOLVED, THE SPECIFIC SWITCHES INVOLVED, AND THE PERIOD OF TIME OVER WHICH THESE PROBLEMS HAVE EXISTED.

A: In addition to the recording problem for Local Plus calls SWBT found the following items:

- Recording on one trunk group between Mid-Missouri and SWBT was found to be using a 913 NPA at the tandem. This would not have adversely affected the creation or passage of any records to Mid-Missouri because recording for calls that were terminated to Mid-Missouri were recorded at the originating end office and not the tandem. This problem was corrected 9-11-00.
- OCA calls originated in Marshall were not recorded correctly. This problem was corrected 8-11-00.
- OCA calls originating in Kirskville, Armstrong, Boonville, Dowling, Edina, Fayette, Glasgow, Higbee, Lancaster and New Franklin were recorded twice, once as a 006 record and once as an 001 record. Recording of the 001 record

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was eliminated. This problem was corrected 9-11-00 and did not have an impact on the creation or passing of appropriate records on these calls.

- A MCI trunk group between BPS and SWBT at Sikeston was not building AMA records. Neither BPS nor SWBT received compensation from MCI.
