What project milestones were completed prior to the Franklin County land use ordinances being adopted? When did Ameren become aware that Franklin County was developing land use ordinances?

In response to the first question, the answer is "no" with respect to ash from Labadie. Ameren Missouri did continue efforts to attempt to find a location where both Meramec's and Rush Island's ash could be stored offsite.

In response to the second question, prior to adoption of the Franklin County Commission Order in October 2011, Ameren Missouri had completed the Preliminary Site Investigation and Detailed Site Investigation for the Labadie UWL. Please see the response to Staff Data Request 2.2 for these reports.

In response to the third question, during the planning process for the Labadie UWL (sometime in the third quarter of 2009) Ameren Missouri reviewed the land use regulations for Franklin County and determined that those regulations made no provisions for the construction and operation of any type of landfills. After meeting with County officials, the Company provided a draft ordinance which the Planning and Zoning Commission considered and revised following public hearings and input. The Franklin County Commission ultimately adopted and revised the current Ordinance after extensive public hearing and input.
