NOTICE THAT APPLICATIONS TO INTERVENE HAVE BEEN GRANTED

Issue Date: October 12, 2010

On September 3, 2010, Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri, filed a tariff designed to increase its annual revenues for electric service. The Commission suspended that tariff and established September 27 as the deadline for interested parties to apply to intervene.

A group of St. Louis area municipalities, collectively known as the Municipal Group, applied to intervene on September 23. The Municipal Group amended its application to intervene on September 29 to add additional municipalities to the group. The municipalities included in that group are the City of O'Fallon, the City of Creve Coeur, the City of University City, the City of Olivette, the City of St. Ann, the City of Kirkwood, the City of Bellefontaine Neighbors, the City of Florissant, the City of Richmond Heights, the Village of Twin Oaks, the City of Ballwin, the City of Brentwood, the Village of Riverview, the City of St. John, the City of Sunset Hills, and the St. Louis County Municipal League. All the municipalities that are seeking to intervene are street lighting customers of Ameren Missouri. At the prehearing conference held on October 12, the presiding officer asked the other parties whether they had any objection to the Municipal Groups' application to

intervene. No party raised any objection. Whereupon, the presiding officer granted the application to intervene.

The Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR) applied to intervene on September 28, which was one day after the September 27 intervention deadline established by the Commission. DNR filed a motion requesting leave to file-out-of-time along with its application. At the prehearing conference held on October 12, the presiding officer asked the other parties whether they had any objection DNR's application to intervene. No party raised any objection. Whereupon, the presiding officer granted the application to intervene.

The International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Locals 2, 309, 649, 702, 1439, 1455, AFL-CIO and International Union of Operating Engineers Local 148, AFL-CIO, (Unions) applied to intervene on October 4, which was after the September 27 intervention deadline established by the Commission. The Unions filed a motion requesting leave to file-out-of-time along with their application. At the prehearing conference held on October 12, the presiding officer asked the other parties whether they had any objection the Union's application to intervene. No party raised any objection. Whereupon, the presiding officer granted the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION STATES THAT:

1. The Application to Intervene of the City of O'Fallon, the City of Creve Coeur, the City of University City, the City of Olivette, the City of St. Ann, the City of Kirkwood, the City of Bellefontaine Neighbors, the City of Florissant, the City of Richmond Heights, the Village of Twin Oaks, the City of Ballwin, the City of Brentwood, the Village of Riverview,

the City of St. John, the City of Sunset Hills, and the St. Louis County Municipal League, collectively known as The Municipal Group, was granted on October 12, 2010.

2. The Missouri Department of Natural Resources' Application to Intervene was granted on October 12, 2010.

3. The Application to Intervene Out of Time filed by The International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Locals 2, 309, 649, 702, 1439, 1455, AFL-CIO and International Union of Operating Engineers Local 148, AFL-CIO, was granted on October 12, 2010.
