1. On November 21, 2005, Staff filed in	ts 2003/2004 ACA Recommendation. That

Staff asked that Aquila respond by January 16, 200	6, to the comments/concerns found in item 2

2. Item 2 of the reliability section conc	erns the reserve margin for the Aquila				
Networks – MPS Southern system. In particular, the	ne Staff sought Aquila's thoughts concerning

3. Aquila agrees that **	** does not consider that there				
may be a variation in the estimated usage for any g	ven temperature. Aquila utilizes linear				
regression, which is an analysis model that takes sta	atistical data and determines a base and a				
variable number. Aquila fully understands that the	e may, and most likely will be, variances for				
the same heating degree day (HDD) on different da	ys. As mentioned in the Staff				
Recommendation, variances can occur because of a	loud cover, wind speed or general variations

in customer consumption, but linear regression does not consider these variables in calculating base/variable.

- 4. Aquila utilizes the Sedalia weather station to perform usage forecast and regression analysis for the MPS Southern system. A majority of MPS Southern system customers are not located in Sedalia, Missouri, but instead in surrounding areas. This would be an additional reason why there would be a discrepancy for a given HDD on different days. Unfortunately, weather information is not available for each one of the communities that Aquila serves. Another phenomenon that Aquila has recognized is that its customer consumption continues to decline year-over-year. This is true throughout Aquila's service areas.
- 5. The school aggregation customers are part of Aquila's analysis. As mentioned in the Recommendation, capacity is released in the school aggregation program. The capacity is released to the transportation customer(s) (through its/their representative) at Aquila's cost. If the customer(s) choose to return to sales, the capacity would be recalled.

6.	Aquila is always concerned with ensuring adequate capacity to meet the MPS
Southern S	ystem peak day requirement. That is the reason Aquila performs regression analysis
each year.	Aquila takes a conservative approach in determining the peak day. **
	** The difficult part in
determining	g the appropriate level of contracted firm entitlement is to cover the projected peak
day without	t having an unused level of entitlement for which MPS Southern customers must pay.
7.	In the event Aquila did not have adequate peak day capacity, Aquila can look to

other alternatives. **

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8. Aquila Networks-MPS evaluates many options in determining the proper levels of firm entitlement and attempting to control the transportation/storage costs that the MPS Southern system customers pay. Based upon the above factors, Aquila believes that the estimated reserve margin for 2005/2006 is not currently a concern.

WHEREFORE, Aquila respectfully requests that the Commission consider this Response and, thereafter, issue such orders as it believes to be reasonable and just.
