ORDER ESTABLISHING TIME IN WHICH TO RESPOND TO MOTION
TO DELAY FILING REBUTTAL TESTIMONY

On September 25, 2006, Missouri Pipeline Company and Missouri Gas Company filed a motion asking the Commission to modify the procedural schedule to delay the filing of rebuttal testimony. That schedule would require the movants to file their rebuttal testimony on October 6. Because that date is fast approaching, Missouri Pipeline and Missouri Gas ask that the Commission rule on their motion by September 29.

Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(15) provides that parties are allowed not more than ten days to respond to a motion unless otherwise ordered by the Commission. Given that the Commission will need to rule on Missouri Pipeline and Missouri Gas' motion promptly, the Commission will shorten the time allowed for the filing of a response. So that the Commission can consider Missouri Pipeline and Missouri Gas' motion at its

September 28 agenda meeting, the Commission will direct any party wishing to respond to that motion to do so by September 27.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. Any party that wants to respond to the Motion to Delay Filing Rebuttal Testimony filed by Missouri Pipeline Company and Missouri Gas Company shall do so no later than September 27, 2006.

2. This order shall become effective on September 26, 2006.
