ORDER GRANTING APPLICATIONS TO INTERVENE

Issue Date: February 15, 2022 Effective Date: February 15, 2022 Evergy Missouri West, Inc. d/b/a Evergy Missouri West submitted tariff sheets on January 7, 2022, to produce a net increase in its electric base rates. The Commission provided notice of Evergy Missouri West's application and set a deadline for applications to intervene.

On January 31, 2022, Renew Missouri Advocates d/b/a Renew Missouri timely filed an application to intervene. Renew Missouri stated that it is a non-profit policy group. Renew Missouri stated its interests are different than those of the general public. Renew Missouri further stated that granting its intervention request would serve the public interest. Renew Missouri stated that it has not yet taken a position on Evergy Missouri West's application.

On February 2, 2022, Dogwood Energy, LLC (Dogwood) timely filed an application to intervene. Dogwood stated that it is a limited liability company that is an owner and operator of a 650 MW combined cycle generating facility within the service territory of Evergy Missouri West. Dogwood stated its interests are different than those of the general public. Dogwood further stated that granting its intervention request would serve the public interest. Dogwood stated that it has not yet taken a position on Evergy Missouri West's application. On February 3, 2022, ChargePoint, Inc. timely filed an application to intervene. ChargePoint stated that it is an electric vehicle charging network. ChargePoint stated its interests are different than those of the general public. ChargePoint further stated that granting its intervention request would serve the public interest. ChargePoint stated that it has not yet taken a position on Evergy Missouri West's application.

More than ten days have passed since the filing of Renew Missouri's, Dogwood's, and ChargePoint's respective applications to intervene and no one has responded.¹ After considering the unopposed applications to intervene, the Commission finds that Renew Missouri, Dogwood, and ChargePoint have interests which are different from that of the general public and allowing them to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 20 CSR 4240-2.075(3), the Commission will grant the applications to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. The application to intervene of Renew Missouri is granted.
- 2. The application to intervene of Dogwood is granted.
- 3. The application to intervene of ChargePoint is granted.
- 4. This order shall be effective when issued.
